We now need \$103,046.52 each month for the next six months to meet our mission goal that we voted to support at the Peoria Convention. Mighty Mites at Work!

Our Mighty Mites at Work is spotlighting our Mission Grant #2, "Student Financial Aid—Full-Time Professional Church Workers – LCMS". The annual tuition cost to students who attend Concordia in St. Paul is over \$29,000. Just three years ago, the amount allocated to full-time students was \$797 - \$1,595. Today, that amount can hardly meet the living expenses with the rising costs of fuel/gas and groceries.

The rising cost of living expenses as well as the financial cost of the education can be a potential barrier to enrollment in synodical colleges and seminaries. With the financial assistance of LWML MN So. District, the debt that students would incur is lessened. The help LWML MN So. District offers will enable the expansion of ministries, planting missions, and the ability to help more students, both men and women. This leads to more future pastors and educators, who are called, to be able to proclaim the Word that leads to salvation.

Concordia, St. Paul - with donations, planning ahead and freezing room and board prices – has re-set its undergraduate tuition rate for Fall 2013 to what it was a decade ago. All Praise to God!

Time for a "Clean Sweep"?

What works for one group may not work for another, as the gifts and talents of the women differ. Congregations vary between rural and urban needs. Therefore, there is no one solution for growth that will satisfy every group.

A tribute to the late Alma Kern in the Spring 2012 issue of the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* includes a quote that she wrote for the magazine in 1968: "Women no longer need the women's society of the church as a social outlet." Alma goes on to say that we do, however, have something very valuable to offer to today's women. "We've got Good News! Jesus has given us the 'pearl of great price.' Let's display it as a jeweler would – in the most attractive way possible. Let's tell it with excitement, enthusiasm, and variety." That is so true, even today!

We need to continue exploring, sharing, and believing that what we have in the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is a gift God wishes for us to share with the world. The work that we do through the LWML in service to our Lord and according to His will is valued and blessed by God.

- · Are you in God's Word regularly? He is the power: May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 15:13).

Is it possible for us to feel this way? Let's meditate on this thought for a moment. Ephesians 2:10 tells us " we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Our Mighty Mites at Work is spotlighting our Mission Grant #1, "The Dwelling Place". October was National Domestic Violence Awareness Month. The following facts come from "The Dwelling Place". **Quick facts:**

- 1 in 3 women will be victims of domestic abuse.
- From 1998-2011, just in MN, 301 women and 149 of their children were murdered as a result of domestic violence.
- Battering is the leading cause of injury to women in the U.S., more than rapes, muggings, and traffic accidents combined.

50% of all homeless women and children are fleeing domestic abuse. Yet the U.S. has three times more animal shelters than shelters for women and children fleeing family violence.(Branson & Silva)

The Dwelling Place is one of only 3 transitional shelters for domestic violence victims in the Twin Cities metro area.
