FROM THE RECTOR'S OFFICE

Dear fellow believers:

February of 2014 will be a little different from the standpoint of the liturgical calendar. 28 out of 38 years, Ash Wednesday falls at some point in February. This year Ash Wednesday is March 5, which means that Easter is April 20. (For your source of useless knowledge: The latest that Easter can be is April 25, though the last time that happened was in 1943 and it won't happen again until 2038. The earliest it can be is March 22, by the way. So now be ready when I ask the question during the Children's Sermon! If you get that question when you win on *Jeopardy*, remember where you heard it and tithe your winnings to the church.)

What this really means is that the whole month of February is dedicated to the Epiphany – indeed, we number the Sundays from January 6 until Ash Wednesday as The Sundays After Epiphany. What does this mean in your own personal life? Not very much --- unless you truly understand what the Epiphany is all about. While we celebrate the day of Epiphany as the day in which the three Wise Men (or however many there were, scripture never really tells us) visited Jesus, it is really so much more than that. The action that we celebrate on Epiphany is really a celebration of the making known of the birth of the Messiah to the gentiles – in the Eastern churches it is known as the manifestation of the incarnation of Jesus Christ. (In some of the Eastern Orthodox Churches, January 6 is actually the day that they celebrate Christ's birth.)

The traditional symbol for the Epiphany is the star – as in the star that the wise men followed in order to find the baby Jesus. There was a time when you would walk into an Episcopal Church and there would be this star high over the altar which would only be lit during the Epiphany season. But there is more symbolism to that star than just giving direction to the Magi. The star also gave

light to the world. (There is a Polish tradition that during the Epiphany season, on February 2, the candles that will be used at Church and in people's homes are blessed.) The star was also used as a way to point to the Messiah – the true light of the world.

The Epiphany collect says: "O God, by the leading of a star you manifested your only Son to the peoples of the earth: Lead us, who know you now by faith, to your presence, where we may see your glory face to face..." As we celebrate the Epiphany, we are called to be "stars" that point and light the way to the Christ. The light which enlivens our souls and hearts in faith is still shining in this restless and weary world. There are those who are searching so desperately for a faith in "something" outside of themselves – something greater then themselves. We who believe know that the "peace of God, which passes all understanding" can be found in the person of Jesus Christ.

During this short but cold month of February, live into the Epiphany and point others to the Christ. Find someone who is living in "darkness and the shadow of death" and bring them to the light of Christ. Jesus is waiting for them – you must be their guide.

Father Joseph started the meeting at 7:05 with prayer.

Minutes from the December 2013 were accepted.

New Vestry members Vicky and Betsy were present.

Year-end financials were reviewed. Basically it was a good year. Treasurer's report provides details. Treasurer advised the committees to spend the money that has been budgeted for them and to spend wisely to grow their missions. Discussion took place regarding the Cash Position and the Self-Funding accounts.

A motion was made to accept the financial report for 2013. The financial report was accepted.

The Dorothy Day Hospitality House is based on the Houses of Hospitality founded by Dorothy Day during the Great Depression. Our Dorothy Day House here in Danbury serves 80-120 hot meals each afternoon AND ALL of the work is done by volunteers -- there is no paid staff!



St. James' has been a supportive, volunteer force in this effort for many years and we want to continue to help feed those in need through this wonderful ministry. But to do so WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!

Our February food prep day is Thursday, February 20th, at 10:00 AM in the Luckenbill Kitchen. We are usually done by noon.

Our February food serve day is Friday, February 21st, at the Dorothy Day Hospitality House (DDHH) at 11 Spring St., Danbury. We meet up at the DDHH around 2:00 PM for set-up and begin serving at 3:15 PM and ending at 4:45 PM. Following the meal we clean up, and if all goes well, we usually wrap up our service day around 5:30 PM.

LOVING SOMEONE WITH AN ADDICTION


Wednesdays February 5 and 19

In this two part offering, we will look at the idea of addiction and how it affects not only the addict but the people he or she loves. This is designed for the family members and close friends of addicts, as well as those who minister to them. We will use a DVD course of the same name as our starting point. According to the DVD, this program will assist friends and family who stand by those they love in addiction:

"Through interviews with experts and personal testimonies, this video presentation offers a guide to:

- Understanding what an addiction really is
- · Understanding the addict you love
- How addiction affects a family
- How to respond to feelings of shame and stigma
- Common difficulties for loved ones such as denial, enabling, fear, and grief
- The meaning and hope of recovery"

All are welcome to attend this offering. Participants will be asked to maintain strict and permanent confidentiality in all that is shared during the time. We will end each session with special prayers for healing for those suffering from addiction.

HEALTH SCREENING AT ST. JAMES'



St James' Episcopal Church is pleased to offer a preventive health event. Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will host their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings on 3/13/2014. Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. 

Here in New England we never know when a storm might hit and how bad it might be. Always we want you to be safe and practical. If the weather is so bad that the Governor closes the roads, please do not attempt to come to Church – you only put yourself and others in harm's way. Here is a way to know if there is no Worship:

Wednesday evening Service and education events - and Sunday mornings The only time Sunday Services are cancelled is if the Mayor declares a Level 3 Snow Emergency or there is a power failure or flooding in downtown Danbury. A Level 3 Snow Emergency means that only emergency vehicles should be on the roads - thus we should all stay home and out of the way of others who might need assistance. Check the television (St. James' will be listed on Channel 8 as "no programs" or as "programs cancelled"), radio, or the Danbury website (www.ci.danbury.ct.us). If none of the above occurs, the Rector will make every effort possible to get here to celebrate the Eucharist for whoever shows up. But again, please use extreme caution if you are planning on coming to Worship during or just after a storm. Also know, if there is a Level 2 Snow emergency, there might not be any parking available unless the front of the Church has been plowed by the City. We will make every effort possible to get the Church lot plowed and shoveled, but if it's in the middle of the storm, this might not happen. If in doubt, you can call the Rector at home. Please see your Parish directory for the number. If all you get is the answering machine, chances are he's at the church already.
