## CELEBRATING THE REGION OF MOLISE

**MOLISE**, the youngest region of Italy. It was once known as *Abruzzo-Molise* until 1963 when *Molise* split off. It was not officially named a region on it's own until 1970.

*Molise* is bordered by *Abruzzo* to the north, *Puglia* to the east, *Lazio* to the west and *Campania* to the south. It has a short coastline on the Adriatic Sea.

Agriculturally *Molise* produces wine, wheat, cereals, olive oil, vegetables, fruits and dairy. Traditional products are grass pea (*cicerchia*) and farro. The cuisine is very similar to that of *Abruzzo*. The menu above will honor the area of *Molise*.

After the earthquakes of 2002 (Two 5.7's on October 31st and November 1st) struck *Molise*, some communities, particularly in *Larino*, adopted a policy to restore homes to their historical colors. Based on research, the town was painted in soft pastel tones. As a result, it has become an important center for tourism. *Molise* has large expanses of unspoiled beaches, a lack of congestion on the roads and a gentle pace that all contribute to the surge in international tourism.
