## Introduction & Course Content


So you're getting into implants, and now you are starting to realize that there's more to it than you first thought. It's not just a matter of learning the technology, it's a matter of re-thinking how to plan a case, how to approach every clinical situation. It's forcing you to re-think everything. The problem is that it's difficult to get help. "Placement Guys" seem disconnected from "Restorative Guys". Take a "Maxi-Course" and you can come out maxi-confused and maxi-hesitant because there's so much information and so many systems. You don't want to get left out, but you want to move forwards cautiously.

How do you get started? Let's just take it one step at a time.


**First**, you need to become more comfortable with implant technology. It's not rocket science. It's not some strange religion. Break an implant down into its four main parts, understand what they are supposed to do. Once you have the basic principles down, things become much more logical.

**Second**, you have to understand the biological environment for implants. Implants don't work if the biological environment around them is not conducive for healing. You need to know how to make sure it is. That means you need to understand how to augment both hard and soft tissues, usually at the same time.


**Third**, you need to understand what is involved in placing implants, how to raise soft tissue flaps, how to prepare bone channels, how positioning the implant platform in the right place makes the difference between an implant that is merely functional and one that looks entirely natural.



**Fourth**, let's understand when to place implants and when to load them. Yes, it's often useful to do immediate placement, but there are many situations when this may not be a good idea. Gaining stability for the implant may be difficult, there may be a need for bone consolidation in the region and it may be tough to get gingival closure. So, deciding when to place an implant can be critical. Equally, there are many times when an implant can be brought immediately transgingival, but there are still situations which call for sub-gingival healing. While it's nice to be able to load implants immediately the situations where this can be done are limited to when there's high-level implant stability and / or a cross-arch loading multi-implant supported situation.



**Fifth**, this is where the vision starts to become the reality. There's lots to do. Implant level impressions need to be made and soft tissue emergence profiles around the implants need to be established. Relationships between teeth, implants and the opposing occlusion need to be verified. With all these developed and reproduced extra-orally on an articulator then it's possible to create implant supported provisional restorations. This can be tedious, but temporaries are quite easy to modify, adjust and re-fabricate. It's better to work things out at this time than to find the final reconstruction does not fit, has a poor appearance and where the occlusion is way-off.



**Sixth**, now comes the move to the final reconstruction. These days it usually involves CAD-CAM fabricated restorations both to develop custom zirconia emergence profiles on abutments and then with the substructures for the final ceramic restorations. If things go as they should then the case is finished and delivered. If things go wrong then it's back to square one.

So there's a great deal of material to cover. Let's get started. Please join us.

Besides being in private practice he has always taught dentistry, first at Penn, where he became Clinical Professor of Periodontics. Later, he was Professor of Restorative Dentistry, Post-Graduate Director and Director of Periodontal Prosthesis and Implant Dentistry at NSU in Fort Lauderdale.

Peter was one of the first dentists in the United States to start using the Camlog Implant System and has been using this system exclusively in his practice since 1999. He was Program Chairman for the 2008 Camlog USA Congress. He was a Panel Chair and Presenter at the 2010 International Camlog Symposium in Basel. He's a Member of Camlog's International Council of Experts. He has lectured widely at Camlog meetings in the United States and in Germany, Holland, Hungary, Japan, Korea and Switzerland.
