Reconciliation is offered here at St. Kateri in the chapel every Saturday from 4pm-5:15pm and at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Newhall every Saturday from 8:45am-10am & 3:30-4:15pm



What happens during the Reconciliation?

Before entering the confessional, you prepare yourself by going through an Examination of Conscience. There are good brochures in our chapel titled "Making a Good Confession" that can walk you through this examination if you didn't pick one up at Confirmation

1. The priest will give a blessing or a greeting.

2. You and the priest will make the Sign of the Cross and you say "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. My last confession was ... (# of weeks, months or years) ago."

3. Name your sins to the priest. (If you are unsure or uneasy, tell him and ask for help.)When you have finished, let the priest know. You can use the words: "I am sorry for all these sins and for any that I cannot now remember."

4. The priest assigns a penance & may offer advice.

5. Say an Act of Contrition, expressing your sorrow for your sins:

"O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments, but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen."

6. The priest, acting in the person of Christ or in persona Christi, then absolves you from your sins.

Where did the sacrament of Reconciliation come from?

Jesus himself instituted the sacrament of Reconciliation when he showed himself to his apostles and commanded them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." John 20:22

Nowhere did Jesus express more beautifully what happens in the sacrament of Reconciliation than in the parable of the Prodigal Son: We go astray, we are lost and can no longer cope. Yet our Father waits for us with great, indeed, infinite longing; he forgives us when we come back; he takes us in again, forgives our sins. Jesus himself forgave the sins of many individuals; it was more important to him than working miracles. He regards this as the great sing of the dawning of the kingdom of God, in which all wounds are healed and all tears are wiped away. Jesus forgave sins in the power of the Holy Spirit, and he handed that power on to his Apostles. We fall into the arms of our heavenly Father when we go to a priest and confess. **YOUCAT 227**
