This included transferring most of the COE staff along with the classes. Mrs. Kirk-Martinez noted there are opportunities to improve. Paraeducators' roles have adjusted as IEPs changed and student needs grew. This increased the need for and challenged the available substitute pool. The impact on Student Services for data entry was greater than anticipated, and site clerical staffing needs also increased. Site administrators have heightened their responses/responsibilities. The change allows the District to independently support most students and also serve students from smaller surrounding districts. Regular students have a sense of understanding and compassion for the new population.

Mr. Miller reviewed the financial efficiencies (\$500,000 annually) of running the programs in house vs. COE service which is not centered at the schools. These savings also benefit other districts who contract with San Luis Coastal for their students. Legal costs have dropped which staff attributes to local control and improved document of an excellent program. Mr. Ungar challenged whether the figures reflect true savings or might still have eben achieved under the COE program.

## Public Participation at Board Meetings (Adopted 2-4-86)

The Board vests in its president or other presiding officer the responsibility to carry out the provisions of this procedure.

<u>Procedure</u>: In order to ensure that a person who wishes to appear before the Board may be heard and, at the same time, conduct its meeting properly and efficiently, the Board adopts the following procedures and rules pertaining to public participation at Board meetings:

- 1. Anyone wishing to speak before the Board, either as an individual or as a representative of a group, will be given the opportunity at this time.
- 2. To assist the presiding officer, any individual desiring to speak shall stand and be recognized, give his or her name and the group, if any, that is represented.
- 3. The presentation should be as brief as possible. Unless an extension of time is granted, a speaker shall be limited to three minutes. Total time allotted for <u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u> will be 20 minutes.
- 4. Questions asked by the public shall, when possible, be answered by the president or referred to staff members present for reply. Questions requiring investigation shall be referred to the Board or administrative staff for study and response at a future meeting.
- 5. The Board will not take action on an item introduced during <u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u> as this would constitute an illegal act on the part of the Board.
- 6. A speaker may offer criticism of school operations and programs that may concern them, but in public session, the Board will not hear personal complaints of school personnel or complaints against any employee of the system. Other channels provide for Board consideration and disposition of complaints involving individuals.

The Board has conferred with legal counsel over the past few months, and held open session discussion on March 16, 2010, regarding the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA). The CVRA prescribes election practices for publicly elected Boards. The gist is that our practice of electing trustees "at large" might be discriminatory towards minority voters in the district.

Legal counsel from Lozano Smith recommended the Board take a proactive step to evaluate the voter diversity following the 2010 census. The results of that review would be used to guide any further discussion and possible decision.

#### METHOD OF ELECTION OF SAN LUIS COASTAL UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT TRUSTEES

- **WHEREAS** members of the Board of Trustees ("Board") of the San Luis Coastal Unified School District ("District") are currently elected at-large; and
- **WHEREAS** the Board wants to ensure compliance with the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA"), and afford minority groups an opportunity to become members of the Board of Trustees; and
- **WHEREAS** the Board currently enjoys diverse representation including gender diversity, religious diversity, and national origin; and
- **WHEREAS** the Board seeks to ascertain whether the election of its governing board members in "at large" elections in which board members reside in a designated trustee area and are elected by registered voters of the entire District has interfered with the ability of members of a minority group or groups to seek and win seats on the governing board; and
- **WHEREAS** the Board is not aware of minority candidates that have been defeated by non-minority candidates, but would like to commission a demographic analysis to study this issue in a historical perspective and determine if racially polarized voting exists; and
- WHEREAS the Board will receive data from the 2010 census in approximately April of 2011; and
- **WHEREAS** if the Board undertakes the process to change the manner of election of board members from an "at-large" system to a "by-trustee area" system, this would require the Board, under applicable provisions of law, to readjust the District's trustee area boundaries following receipt of new data from the 2010 census; and
- **WHEREAS** the Board, cognizant of its reduced operating revenues and need for fiscal conservancy, desires to determine if any change should be made to its manner of electing board members in the most cost effective and efficient manner;
- **NOW, THEREFORE,** the Board of Trustees of the San Luis Coastal Unified School District hereby resolves as follows:
  - In 2011, following receipt of the census data and the upcoming general election results, to commission a demographic study and expert analysis to determine whether the history of recent elections in the District necessitates a change to the method of electing members of the Board of Trustees to comply with CVRA; and
  - 2. If an expert analysis of voting patterns reveals that such a change to the election process in District is appropriate and required to overcome "racially polarized voting patterns," then by this resolution, the Board commits itself to take action at the appropriate time to adopt a change in the method of electing members of the District's Board of Trustees from "at-large elections" (Cal. Educ. Code § 5030(c)) to "by-trustee elections" (Cal. Elec. Code §5030(b)) so that the change can be implemented using new 2010 census data; and

- 3. The District Superintendent and his designee are hereby authorized and directed to retain counsel to commission a demographic study in accordance with the intent of this resolution and to take steps to effectuate the intent of this resolution; and
- 4. The District Superintendent and his designee are hereby authorized and directed to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.

(a)(8) Any member who does not attend all meetings held in any month may receive, as compensation for his or her services, an amount not greater than the maximum amount allowed by this subdivision divided by the number of meetings held and multiplied by the number of meetings actually attended.
In accordance with these terms, a Board member's salary is automatically reduced proportionately for any month when a member is absent from any meeting. However, Board members may request payment for a missed meeting in the following circumstances:
(c) A member may be paid for any meeting when absent if the board by resolution duly adopted and included in its minutes finds that at the time of the meeting he or she is performing services outside the meeting for the school district or districts, he or she was ill or on jury duty, or the absence was due to a hardship deemed acceptable by the board.
This agenda item is provided to document that a Board member's absence meets the criteria of Education Code Section 35120 (c). A copy of the Board member "Absence Report" is attached for the Board's consideration.

Funds for Board member salaries are paid from the General Fund. Approval of this item authorizes the expenditure of funds previously budgeted.

DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:
Biannually all public agencies must review their conflict of interest codes and submit any revisions to the San Luis Obispo County Board of Supervisors, which is the code-reviewing body. Changes become effective thirty days following approval by the Board of Supervisors.
SLCUSD Bylaw 9270 incorporates the regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC), thus ensuring the most current regulations are always in effect. The biennial review provides an opportunity to review the Appendix designating who must file under the code.
One position listed in the Appendix should be removed as it was eliminated during a department restructuring (Asst. Director of BG&T). Staff recommends no further changes to the conflict of interest code.

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

#### **Incompatible Activities**

Board of Education members shall not engage in any employment or activity which is inconsistent with, incompatible with, in conflict with or inimical to the Board member's duties as an officer of the district. (Government Code 1126)

#### **Conflict of Interest Code**

The district's conflict of interest code shall comprise of the terms of California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730 and any amendments to it adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, together with a district attachment specifying designated positions and the specific types of disclosure statements required for each position.

Upon direction by the code reviewing body, the Board shall review the district's conflict of interest code in even-numbered years. If no change in the code is required, the district shall submit by October 1 a written statement to that effect to the code reviewing body. If a change in the code is necessitated by changed circumstances, the district shall submit an amended code to the code reviewing body. (Government Code 87306.5)

When a change in the district's conflict of interest code is necessitated by changed circumstances such as the creation of new designated positions, amendments or revisions shall be submitted to the code reviewing body within 90 days. (Government Code 87306)

When reviewing and preparing conflict of interest codes, the district shall provide officers, employees, consultants and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code 87311)

If a Board member or designated employee determines that he/she has a financial interest in a decision, as described in Government Code 87103, this determination shall be disclosed. The member shall be disqualified from voting unless his/her participation is legally required. (2 CCR 18700)

Statements of economic interests submitted to the district by designated employees in accordance with the conflict of interest code shall be available for public inspection and reproduction. (Government Code 81008)

#### **Abstentions**

When a Board member abstains from voting on an issue, he/she shall state the reasons for this abstention, as other Board members may need this information in order to determine the level or type of conflict involved.

#### **Financial Interest**

Board members and designated employees shall not be financially interested in any contract made by the Board or in any contract they make in their capacity as Board members or designated employees. (Government Code 1090)

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

A Board member shall not be considered to be financially interested in a contract if his/her interest includes, but is not limited to, any of the following: (Government Code 1091.5)

- 1. That of an officer who is being reimbursed for his/her actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of an official duty
- 2. That of a recipient of public services generally provided by the public body or board of which he/she is a member, on the same terms and conditions as if he or she were not a member of the board
- 3. That of a landlord or tenant of the contracting party if such contracting party is the federal government or any federal department or agency, this state or an adjoining state, any department or agency of this state or an adjoining state, any county or city of this state or an adjoining state, or any public corporation or special, judicial or other public district of this state or an adjoining state unless the subject matter of such contract is the property in which such officer or employee has such interest as landlord or tenant in which even his/her interest shall be deemed a remote interest within the meaning of, and subject to, the provisions of Government Code 1091
- 4. That of a spouse of an officer or employee of the district if his/her spouse's employment or officeholding has existed for at least one year prior to his/her election or appointment
- 5. That of a nonsalaried member of a nonprofit corporation, provided that such interest is disclosed to the Board at the time of the first consideration of the contract, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records
- 6. That of a noncompensated officer of a nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation which, as one of its primary purposes, supports the functions of the nonprofit board or to which the school Board has legal obligation to give particular consideration, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records
- 7. That of a person receiving salary, per diem, or reimbursement for expenses from a governmental entity, unless the contract directly involves the department of the government entity that employs the officer or employee, provided that such interest is disclosed to the Board at the time of consideration of the contract, and provided further that such interest is noted in its official records
- 8. That of an attorney of the contracting party or that of an owner, officer, employee or agent of a firm which renders, or has rendered, service to the contracting party in the capacity of stockbroker, insurance agent, insurance broker, real estate agent, or real estate broker, if these individuals have not received and will not receive remuneration, consideration, or a commission as a result of the contract and if these individuals have an ownership interest of less than 10 percent in the law practice or firm, stock brokerage firm, insurance firm or real estate firm

In addition, a Board member or employee shall not be deemed to be interested in a contract made pursuant to competitive bidding under a procedure established by law if his/her sole interest is that of an officer, director, or employee of a bank or savings and loan association with which a party to the contract has the relationship of borrower or depositor, debtor or creditor. (Government Code 1091.5)

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

A Board member shall not be deemed to be financially interested in a contract if he/she has only a remote interest in the contract and if the remote interest is disclosed during a Board meeting and noted in the official Board minutes. The affected Board member shall not vote or debate on the matter or attempt to influence any other Board member to enter into the contract. Remote interests are specified in Government Code 1091(b); they include, but are not limited to, the interest of a parent in the earnings of his/her minor child. (Government Code 1091)

A Board member may enter into a contract if the rule of necessity or legally required participation applies as defined in Government Code 87101.

Even if there is no prohibited or remote interest, a Board member shall abstain from voting on personnel matters that uniquely affect a relative of the Board member. A Board member may vote, however, on collective bargaining agreements and personnel matters that affect a class of employees to which the relative belongs. "Relative" means an adult who is related to the person by blood or affinity within the third degree, as determined by the common law, or an individual in an adoptive relationship within the third degree. (Education Code 35107)

A relationship within the third degree includes the individual's parents, grandparents and great-grandparents, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren, brothers, sisters, aunts and uncles, nieces and nephews, and the similar family of the individual's spouse unless the individual is widowed or divorced.

#### Gifts

Board members and designated employees may accept gifts only under the conditions and limitations specified in Government Code 89503 and 2 CCR 18730.

The limitations on gifts do not apply to wedding gifts and gifts exchanged between individuals on birthdays, holidays and other similar occasions, provided that the gifts exchanged are not substantially disproportionate in value. (Government Code 89503)

Gifts of travel and related lodging and subsistence shall be subject to the prevailing gift limitation except as described in Government Code 89506.

A gift of travel does not include travel provided by the district for Board members and designated employees. (Government Code 89506)

#### Honoraria

Board members and designated employees shall not accept any honorarium, which is defined as any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private gathering, in accordance with law. (Government Code 89501, 89502)

The term honorarium does not include: (Government Code 89501)

1. Earned income for personal services customarily provided in connection with a bona fide business, trade or profession unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade or profession is making speeches

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

2. Any honorarium which is not used and, within 30 days after receipt, is either returned to the donor or delivered to the district for donation into the general fund without being claimed as a deduction from income for tax purposes

#### **CONFLICT OF INTEREST**

#### **DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES**

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of investments, business entities, sources of income, or real property which the designated employee must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned.

<u>Category 1</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District, plan to do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of the District within the next year, or have done business or owned real property within the jurisdiction of the District within the past two (2) years.

<u>Category 2</u>: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of the District.

<u>Category 3</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of the District, plan to engage in such activities within the jurisdiction of the District within the next year, or have engaged in such activities within the jurisdiction of the District within the past two (2) years.

<u>Category 4</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that are banking, savings and loan, or other financial institutions.

<u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the District.

<u>Category 6</u>: All investments and business positions in, and sources of income from, business entities that provide services, supplies, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the Designated Employee's Department.

<u>Consultant</u>: A consultant is an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the district, makes a governmental decision whether to: (2 CCR 18701.)

- a. Approve a rate, rule or regulation
- b. Adopt or enforce a law
- c. Issue, deny, suspend or revoke a permit, license, application, certificate, approval, order or similar authorization or entitlement
- d. Authorize the district to enter into, modify or renew a contract that requires district approval
- e. Grant district approval to a contract or contract specifications which require district approval and in which the district is a party
- f. Grant district approval to a plan, design, report, study or similar item
- g. Adopt or grant district approval of district policies, standards or guidelines

A consultant is also an individual who, pursuant to a contract with the district, serves in a staff capacity with the district and in that capacity participates in making a governmental decision as defined in 2 CCR 18702.2 or performs the same or substantially all the same duties for the district that would otherwise be performed by an individual holding a position specified in the district's Conflict of Interest Code. (2 CCR 18701.)

#### **DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA ITEM:**

San Luis Coastal is fortunate to have dedicated parents and community members who volunteer time, money, and services for the purpose of enhancing and enriching the educational experience of our students. School-connected organizations are separate legal entities, independent of the school and district. However, Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 1230 require that all school-connected organizations be approved by the Board of Education and establish requirements for that approval.

In the fall of 2009, the Board expressed an interest in learning more about the school-connected organizations in the district. At the same time, staff updated BP/AR 1230 to comply with current law and recommendations of the California School Boards Association (CSBA).

Subsequently, staff began a review of available documentation on each of the listed groups to determine compliance with requirements of the revised BP/AR 1230, which include Board approval, procurement of a federal tax identification number, insurance requirements, financial accounting, etc. Most of the organizations have existed for years – perhaps dating back to the district's unification. It was determined that many of the existing organizations were non-compliant with one or more of the updated requirements and Board approval could be located for only three of the organizations: Charles E. Teach Booster Club, San Luis Obispo High School Aquatics Boosters, and San Luis Obispo High School Instrumental Music Boosters Association (SLO-IMBA).

Late fall of 2009, the principal/designee at each school began assisting the officers of each organization toward compliance with the Board policy and administrative regulation governing these types of groups. While progress has been made toward fulfilling the requirements to request Board approval, many of the groups are not currently compliant to be legitimate fund-raising organizations. Only the PTAs and the Morro Bay High School Aggie Boosters meet all the requirements to request Board approval at this time. Staff will continue to assist the remaining organizations (MBHS Athletic Boosters, Blue & White Boosters, Music Boosters; SLOHS Aggie Backers, Black & Gold Boosters, Gridiron Club) and will request Board approval when their compliance is verified.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**
