Attention all University/ College/ Technical School Students:

Cross Roads Community Presbyterian Church has established a scholarship for any traditional or adult student who is currently enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student in a university/college/technical school. This one-time award is for \$1,000.00.

Eligible students must be a member of CRCPC and be a sophomore, junior or senior undergraduate or a graduate student who has earned at least a 3.0 GPA.

Applications will be available in the church office beginning January 1, 2015 or can be downloaded from the church web page. Students must complete the scholarship application and submit it with official university/college/technical school transcripts and letters of recommendation no later than June 1, 2015. The applicant must also submit a 500 word essay on "The Importance of Giving Back." The scholarship recipient (and congregation) will be notified by July 15, 2015.

The selection committee will consist of at least 3 CRCPC members, one of whom will be a session member, and the selection process will be a blind one. Students awarded the scholarship may not apply in subsequent years. However, students may apply more than once if they were not a past recipient of the scholarship.

know what it says in the Bible but those kisses and hugs will get you trouble. Just ask me, I know!

I attended the 2104 General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. I was sitting with the representatives from Kiskiminetas Presbytery. The discussion at the General Assembly on this particular day was, *"What definition of marriage should be in the Book of Order?"*

It was a hot debate with folk from each side spewing scripture to affirm their position. When the vote was taken the definition of marriage was changed. It now reads that marriage is a *"unique commitment between two people, traditionally a man and a woman, to love and support each other for the rest of their lives."* There was crying and there was rejoicing following that very, very close vote.

I was not happy about how the decision came to be and was pretty upset. My good friend, Bill, a pastor from the eastern part of the state was sitting behind me. He was rejoicing in the decision! We gave each other a 'holy hug' in his time of joy and my time of stress. **Click...Click!**

A photographer from the Associated Press took a picture of two guys hugging each other. The 'holy hug!' Since that time my picture has been in hundreds of papers around the world. I am now a stock photo in the Associated Press files with a caption that says I am celebrating the decision of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. on the definition of marriage. Incorrect!

My phone rang last week. A cousin I hadn't heard from in 3 or 4 years was in Wilmington, NC and had just opened his newspaper. There was the 'holy hug' photo staring at him. He laughed. A friend sent me a link to the Washington Post. There I am. An elder from a church in Kiskiminetas Presbytery asked me my sexual preference when she saw the 'holy hug' in the Indiana, PA paper. She was serious and I've been married for 36 years!

Holy kisses? Holy hugs? I don't think so! You just never know where a camera is lurking.

Keep the faith, my friends. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Alleluia.
