Notes from Sermon

Trying to keep up with Mark is like trying to hold back an 80-pound puppy yanking on a leash.

To the astonishment of Peter and the others, Jesus shows little interest in staying in Capernaum.

The Greek original tells us that he went to a deserted place, an echo of that desert where the nature of his life was hammered out.

What Mark wants us to know is that it was a temptation for Jesus to cave into the popularity of being the kind of Messiah everybody wanted.

“Everyone is searching for you.” The passing of twenty centuries has not diminished either the truth or the hyperbole of that statement.

We are in such a strange time, spiritually.
