So, it was back into St. John's for Becky! After suffering a mild seizure yesterday, Beck is, at this writing, stable, on anti-seizure meds. and beginning to feel better.

She is, I believe, in room 580 in St. John's Hospital in Tulsa.

Sadly, it was necessary to euthanize her horse, Ike, as he was experiencing severe neurological problems following the accident.

Please keep Becky and her family in your prayers as she begins the long road back to recovery. She will appreciate them so much. And,....let's all be careful out there.

DON'T RIDE BACKWARDS

Rolf A. Vlatten M.D.

This was a comment often heard in a clinic given by a certified German riding teacher. What he was referring to was the position of a rider who was leaning his body far back while asking his horse for wxtended gaits.

Leaning back and therefore shortening the reins hinders the horse in lengthening of the stride and frame. Increased pull on the bit with increased leg and back pressure will cause shorter and faster stredes and a horse cramped in the neck; spastic at the poll and tense in the back. Increased speed will decrtease engagement of the hind legs and thereby make it impossible for the horse to maintain impulsion.

When asked to lengthen the stride, to ride medium or extended gaits; sit up straight; let your mount stretch slightly more into the bit and give him a chance to carry himself more forward. This is what the word impulsion means.

RIDING FORWARD Rolf A. Vlatten M.D.

I judged a show in a state where few experienced riders are located and riders have no exposure to the better horses and riders. Judging the rides one suspected that some of the horses and riders were half asleep while others were in the state of anxiety. Rides were too fast, rushed and unbalanced with horses falling over the inside shoulder on circles and in turns. The sleepy riders were too slow; not forward enough with horses nearly asleep in the walk. The sleepy horses needed too much time to cover the ground.

A well ridden test on a good horse will be forward with engagement of the hind legs producing impulsion and resulting in ground covering, animated strides.

Avoiding short and rushing strides is one of the main goals of basic training. A good forward moving horse is neither anxious nor sleepy.

ODS 2008 SCHOOLING SHOW REPORT

ODS had 15 sponsored Schooling Shows across the state in 2008

The count for the years schooling shows of 2008 break down this way:

Intro horses numbered 78 for the year with 40 Juniors, 30 Amateurs, and 9 Open riders.

The count for the Training Level horses was 48 with 20 Juniors, 22 Amateurs, and 10 Open riders.

First Level horses were counted in at 14 with 2 Juniors, 9 Amateurs, and 3 Open.

Second Level was 2 horses with both riders being Open.

We did have one Third Level horse with an Open rider also that year.

Total for all was 143 horses in the state of Oklahoma participated in the ODS Schooling Shows and 148 riders.

We had one state Schooling Show Championship with 31 horses and 27 riders participating.
