The Denishawn dances presented today were chorographed by Ruth St. Denis and Ted Shawn, the "mother and father" of American Modern Dance, who together created their Denishawn Company in the early twentieth century. Don McDonagh, New York Times dance critic and historian, described Denishawn as "the cradle of American modern dance." These dances were originally learned by Marion Rice, a student of Denishawn at the Braggiotti-Denishawn School in Boston in the 1930's, who then went on to perform and teach them and others in her Fitchburg, MA studio for 60 years, eventually passing on the legacy to her granddaughters, Robin and Rebecca Rice, and student, Valerie Farias Newton. Nevers' Second Regiment Band is Concord, NH's professional community band, dedicated to bringing an annual series of summer concerts to New Hampshire citizens. The band's name is derived from its military affiliations with the Second Regiment of the New Hampshire National Guard and Arthur Nevers, a cornetist from Claremont, who directed the band for more than fifty years beginning in 1884. Nevers' Band has reflected its military history since the beginning of the Civil War when, in 1861, it accompanied the Third New Hampshire Regiment to Hilton Head, South Carolina.

What began with a single piano recital has grown to an annual series of 11 concerts, presented to those who visit the park. The 2014 summer concerts feature outstanding musicians who bring their talents to an eclectic series of programs drawing from classical, jazz, ethnic and musical theater genres. We hope that you will make these concerts a Sunday afternoon tradition and introduce others to music at the park.

The Saint-Gaudens Memorial is a private, non-profit New Hampshire organization, established in 1919 to maintain a living memorial to Augustus Saint-Gaudens on the site of his home and studios. In 1964, the property—including structures, works of art and furnishings—was donated to the United States for public ownership and in 1965 Congress created the Saint-Gaudens National Historic Site. The Memorial partners with the historic site to increase public awareness of the life, world and work of Saint-Gaudens; preserve and interpret the cultural resources at the site; and promote the arts in general. We do this through educational and artistic programs, advice and other forms of support.
