

A **stylesheet** is a set of house rules intended to ensure consistency of format, spelling, capitalization, abbreviation, word usage, and other technicalities peculiar to an organization or publisher. Consistent style helps LLL publications to appear professional and credible.

Grammar and usage questions not covered by this stylesheet use a standard guide such as The Chicago Manual of Style (University of Chicago Press), Gregg Reference Manual (Macmillan/ McGraw Hill), A Dictionary of Modern English Usage by HW Fowler (Oxford University Press), or The Canadian Style: A Guide to Writing and Editing (Department of the Secretary of the State).

CAPITALIZATION, ABBREVIATION, AND USAGE

Abbreviations may confuse readers. Use them at your discretion. Job titles and names of departments vary around the world, so those abbreviations are not shown here. Spell out all titles and departments on first reference in an article. Capitalize the following words and phrases as shown. Do not abbreviate unless indicated in parentheses.

Spell out state/province in body of article or biography; no commas before and after postal code. Two-letter postal abbreviations may be used in block style and bylines; no punctuation is necessary.

When describing personal experiences, use personal pronouns for milk and babies wherever possible:

USE: my milk, her milk, my baby,

her baby, his baby, our baby AVOID: baby (without "a," or "the")

Publications

Use caps and small caps when referencing LLLI Publications. THE Womanly Art of Breastfeeding may be referred to as The Womanly Art on second reference. No other shortened forms or abbreviations of other titles should be used.

Italicize or underline

Web site: Author(s) last name, Initial [or company/organization name]. Title of article [italicize], date of publication or last revision. URL in angle brackets, date of access in parentheses.

INTERNET RESOURCES:

Web sites may be shown as sources to help readers find more information. Provide both Web address and mailing address of the organization so readers without Internet access may also find information. Avoid listing Web sites that have a high potential for mixing causes.

Avoid using Web sites as references for factual information, since Web sites may change frequently. Find a printed source for factual information when possible.

USAGE

A Web site is a collection of pages under one domain name (such as lalecheleague.org). "LLLI Web site" refers to all the pages on the site, or the concept of having a Web site. "LLLI Web page" refers to a single page within the Web site. Ex. "Look for our Group's Web page on the LLLI Web site."
