**Blade Shavings.** Here are some tidbits I’ve picked up about this year’s crop of Zebras. Two more referees will be joining the NHL’s Officiating Staff for the coming season. Gord Dwyer who worked in the CHL and Steve Kozari from the WHL both signed minor league contracts which means they will primarily work in the AHL. The NHL has promoted linesman Ryan Galloway from a trainee to full-time contract.

Galloway, 31, is a native of Winnipeg, Manitoba and worked 22 NHL games during the 2002-2003 season, which was his first in the league. Also, the NHL has promoted referees Craig Spada, Ian Walsh, and Jay Sharrers to full-time status. Spada, 31, is a native of Welland, Ontario and was hired after working the 2001 OHL Championship Series. He also holds his Level VI with Hockey Canada and is active in the development of young officials in the OHA. Walsh, 31, is a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and was hired in 1999. He is still active in USA Hockey at various clinics and development camps. Sharrers, 36, is a native of New Westminster, British Columbia and was hired as a linesman in 1990. After working the Stanley Cup Finals in 1999 and 2000, he became a referee.

"We have a plan," Therrien said, "and we are going to make sure we follow our plan and eventually will win games. What is important is winning." With this statement, Wilkes-Barre/Scanton was introduced to its new coach on July 15 at 2 p.m..

Therrien, 39, brings some coaching experience with him to Wilkes-Barre. He most recently coached the Montreal Canadiens for parts of three seasons (2000-2003), leading the proud franchise to a mark of 77-77-22-14 over a span of 190 games. Prior to that, he honed his coaching skills at the developmental levels.

"I knew I was going to have to come back to the American League," Therrien said. "To get a chance to work with young, good prospects -- that was something I was looking for."

Mike Yeo, Glenn Patrick's assistant for the past 31/2 seasons, will return as Therrien's lone assistant. Yeo, 29, had expressed interest in the head coaching position, but Patrick said he was looking for someone with a little more experience.

"I'm pretty realistic," Yeo said. "I don't want to say I'm not ready for a head coaching job, because I know I am, but I also know I have a lot to learn. Working with a coach like Michel, who's had success at every level, will be a great opportunity for me."

"Yes, I've got some passion. I'm a warrior behind the bench," Therrien said. "I think players like that. I think they need to get pushed and they need to feel the guy over there is in the game."

Center Toby Petersen, who spent all of last season with the Baby Pens, agreed that Therrien's hiring will certainly represent a change of pace in Wilkes-Barre.
