## Additional Payment Details.

- Payments can be made through Charms or with a payment form
- The first payment confirms that the student will travel with us. This payment is nonrefundable for any reason. This confirmation also commits the student to paying for their portion of the bus and hotel even if the student chooses not to attend.
- The first payment should include a "intent to travel" form.
- While each student will be responsible for paying $\$ 950$, the actual trip cost will be more than that. The band fund will pick up the difference between $\$ 950$ and the actual cost. The actual cost will be made known as soon as possible if a family would like to pay for their child's entire trip.
- Please pay ahead of schedule, if and when possible.
- Be sure that a payment form is used whenever you make a payment
- All payments and forms should be in a sealed envelope
- Turn in all payments to the BHS Band office. Do not send through mail.
- Make all checks out to BEAVERCREEK MUSIC PARENTS (BMPA)
- You may pay fees with visa or master card though Charms, but you will need to add a $3 \%$ bank service fee.
- If you plan to use funds from your student account please move all money to your Florida fees at one time. Please transfer these funds A.S.A.P.
- All parents traveling on the bus are considered chaperones. Chaperone fees will be the same as student fees except for the additional charge for room choice:
- Total with a double room would be $\$ 1,115.00$ per person
- Total with a single room would be $\$ 1,394.00$
- *Payment schedule for chaperones is the same as students except the total due must be adjusted by the last payment
