

2015 RESIDENT SPRING WILD TURKEY LICENSE APPLICATION (FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED)

North Dakota Game and Fish Department Licensing Division, SFN 6549

This application may be used by persons who don't have a 2015 spring wild turkey license or by persons who already have one 2015 spring wild turkey license (limit of two). Only residents are eligible to apply for first come, first served spring turkey licenses. The Department will begin processing applications on March 18.

HOW LICENSES WILL BE ISSUED

The 2015 spring wild turkey lottery has been held and there are licenses remaining in 9 units (see listing of units on back). These licenses will be issued on a "first come, first served" basis as applications are received by the Department and as long as licenses last. The Department will begin processing applications on March 18. Applications can be sent online, mailed, or turned in to the Department's Bismarck office. Online and mailed applications will be processed before hand delivered applications each day. (Hand delivered applications will not be processed while you wait. Licenses will be mailed to you.) For online applying, please visit our website at af.nd.aov.

Remaining licenses are to be considered "additional", regardless of whether or not you already have one license. By using this form, you are allowed up to a total of two licenses for the 2015 spring wild turkey season. You may apply for two licenses at this time but you must use a separate application for each license applied for. Applications for a first license will have no preference over applications for a second license. Should we be unable to issue you a license, you will receive a refund.

- 1. **PARTIES:** There are no provisions for applicants to apply as a party. The number of persons has already been filled in for you.
- 2. HUNTING UNIT CHOICE(S): See backside for map and listing of licenses remaining. You are allowed two choices. Enter your choice of unit(s) in box(es) to the right.
- 3. FEE: The fee is \$15.00. Do not send cash. Personal checks, cashier's checks or money orders are acceptable. Make payable to N.D. Game and Fish Department. Unsuccessful applicants will receive a refund. Insufficient funds checks will be turned over to a collection agency and subject to additional costs. If money is not collected, the applicant will be ineligible for both the current year and the following year.

Other licenses required: Hunters, regardless of age, must also possess a fishing, hunting and furbearer certificate (\$1.00) and a general game and habitat license (\$20.00). In addition, hunters 16 years of age and older must possess a small game license (\$10.00) or a combination license (\$50.00) before hunting wild turkeys. These licenses can be purchased from the Department, any license vendor, by calling tollfree 1-800-406-6409, or via our website at gf.nd.gov.


- I have actually lived in the state of North Dakota or maintained my residence therein for the past six months (residency waivers are not eligible);

Unit 13	Dunn County.
Unit 19	Grant County, Sioux County, and that part of Morton County south of I-94 that lies west of Morton County Road No. 86 (the Almont to Carson road) and that part of Morton County north of I-94 that lies west of ND No. 31.
Unit 25	McHenry County and that part of Pierce County west of ND No. 3 and that part of Ward County that lies east of US Highway 83.
Unit 31	Mountrail County.
Unit 45	Stark County.
Unit 47	Eddy County, Foster County, Kidder County, Sheridan County, Stutsman County and Wells County.
Unit 51	Burke County, all of Renville County except that portion east of US Highway 83, that part of Bottineau County west of US Highway 83, and that part of Ward County that lies west of US Highway 83.
Unit 99	Mercer County and Oliver County.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER REQUIREMENT. In accordance with state law NDCC 20.1-03-35 and 42 US Code 666 (a) (13) and (16), the Department is required to collect social security numbers from all persons obtaining hunting, fishing, or other recreational type licenses. Your social security number serves as your principal identification number to determine license eligibility. It is kept confidential, however it may be provided to law enforcement agencies and the State Disbursement Unit to enforce child support obligations.



In accordance with state law (NDCC 20.1-02-05), a resident who is eighteen years of age or older must submit a ND drivers license number or a ND nondriver photo ID number when applying for a license.

The NDGFD receives federal financial assistance from the US Fish and Wildlife Service.
