# **APPLICATION INFORMATION**

- · Applications will be rejected, fees forfeited and permits revoked if you receive or attempt to receive more than one either-sex and/or one bonus antlerless-only MUZZLELOADER permit before August 21. You can apply during the 2nd lottery for both the firearm lottery and the muzzleloader-only lottery.
- · Permits are not transferable and no refunds will be made unless your county, hunt area or season choices are not available.

## **SEASON DATES**

December 11,12, &13 (muzzleloader-only season)

December 3, 4, 5 & 6 (second firearm season)

#### **APPLICATION DATES**

If your application is received after the deadline, you will be entered automatically into the next application period.

**SECOND LOTTERY** - Applications from non-residents and anyone that does not have a permit will be accepted through June 30.

THIRD LOTTERY - Applications for the Third Lottery will be accepted through August 21. Anyone (regardless of other deer permits they may have) may apply for one or more permits in this lottery.

OVER THE COUNTER SALE - Any remaining permits will be available over-the-counter from license vendors beginning October 20 on a first come, first serve basis. Permits will be sold until quotas are exhausted, or until the close of the firearm deer season, whichever occurs first. Individuals can purchase one or more permits during this period, subject to availability.

Bonus & Third Lottery Antlerless-Only: \$25

# **LICENSE & HABITAT STAMP**

#### LICENSE:

In addition to your deer permit, you must have a valid Illinois Hunting License, Sportsmen's, Apprentice or Youth Hunting License unless you are a person who is disabled and able to show proof of disability in the form of one of the following:

- · A State disabled person I.D. card (available from the Secretary of State through the drivers license examining station) showing a P2, P2A, H2 or H2A disability.
- Veterans disability card (at least 10% service related); available from local Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs offices.

#### HABITAT STAMP: (\$5.50)

Before any person 16 years of age or older takes, attempts to take, or pursues any species of wildlife protected by the Wildlife Code, except migratory waterfowl, coots, and hand-reared birds on licensed game breeding and hunting preserve areas and state controlled pheasant hunting areas, he or she shall first obtain a State Habitat Stamp. Disabled veterans and former prisoners of war shall not be required to obtain State Habitat Stamps. Any person who obtained a Lifetime License before January 1, 1993, shall not be required to obtain a State Habitat Stamp.

# **LEGAL FIREARMS**

- Shotguns, loaded with slugs only, of not larger than 10 nor smaller than 20 gauge, not capable of firing more than three consecutive slugs; or
- Single or double barreled muzzleloading rifles of at least .45 caliber shooting a single projectile through a barrel of at least 16 inches in length; or
- Centerfire revolvers or centerfire single-shot handguns of .30 caliber or larger with a minimum barrel length of 4 inches.

#### **MUZZLELOADER**

- A muzzleloading firearm is defined as a firearm that is incapable of being loaded from the breech end.
- Only black powder or a "black powder substitute" such as Pyrodex may be used. Modern smokeless powders (nitrocellulose-based) are an approved blackpowder substitute only in muzzleloading firearms specifically designed for their use.
- Percussion caps (shotgun primers are legal percussion caps), wheellock, matchlock or flint type ignition only may be used, except the Connecticut Valley Arms (CVA) electronic ignition shall be legal to use.

#### **LEGAL AMMUNITION**

- For shotguns and muzzleloading firearms, the minimum size of the projectile shall be .44 caliber. A wad or sleeve is not considered a projectile or a part of the projectile.
- For handguns, a bottleneck centerfire cartridge of .30 caliber or larger with a case length not exceeding 1.4 inches, or a straightwalled centerfire cartridge of .30 caliber or larger, both of which must be available as a factory load with the published ballistic tables of the manufacturer showing a capability of at least 500 foot pounds of energy at the muzzle. There is no case length limit for straight-walled cartridges.
- Non-expanding, military-style full metal jacket bullet cannot be used to harvest white-tailed deer; only soft point or expanding bullets (including copper/copper-alloy rounds designed for hunting) are legal ammunition.

## **SPECIAL HUNT AREAS**

Special hunts held on federal or state lands are regulated by the agency which manages the property. Some of these areas are included in the lotteries. If you wish to apply for a permit to hunt one of these areas you will need to do the following:

- 1. Go to our website at www.dnr.illinois.gov
- 2. Select the Deer Hunting Page
- 3. Under the "Quick Links" column located on the right side of the page, select the link "Available Deer Permits by County"
- 4. Select the list located under the "Deer" heading

This will provide you a list of available deer permits. Located at the bottom of this list will be the SHA names and abbreviations used to apply for these permits. Special Hunt Area permits are ONLY valid for the Special Hunt Area that is printed on the hunting permit. County permits are NOT valid for Special Hunt Areas. For more information regarding locations and requirements of special hunt areas only, call the Division of Wildlife at 217-782-6384.

# FIREARM OWNER'S I.D. CARD (Issued by Illinois State Police)

Regardless of who owns the gun, anyone who has a firearm or firearm ammunition in their possession must have in their possession a valid Firearm Owner's I.D. (F.O.I.D.) Card unless he or she is:

- a) A licensed out-of-state sportsman hunting in Illinois, or
- b) Under the age of 21 and under the immediate control of a parent. guardian, or responsible adult who has in their possession a valid F.O.I.D. Card.
