125th Anniversary of our special school is Sunday April 6th from 10am to 5pm. Our senior students will be taking tours around the school at 11am. There will be a showing of the documentary about Balgownie and time to reminisce about school life with long lost friends.

On Friday 4th April, our students will be dressing in clothes from 1889 and learning about 'olden days' school life. Start thinking about costumes! There will be bush dancing, lessons in rows, playground games and other

activities to make history come alive.

We need help for the working bee the weekend before the anniversary to make sure our school looks at its best and donations of cakes on the day for sale to the visitors. We also need a few people to sell cakes on the day. More details to follow on how you can help.

It will be wonderful to celebrate 125 years of learning and think about how many children have been educated in our heritage building and the more modern additions.

A day in history.....

- 1908 The formation of Balgownie Parents and Citizens Association. They were very vocal with complaints about overcrowding, as classes were being held in weather sheds.
- 1911 Another room was added to existing building.
- 1921 Plans drawn for the addition of 1 more room plus modifications to the older rooms. The stepped floors were removed and the windows were remodeled to provide better ventilation and lighting.

Science 'incursion' makes learning rich in our school. We have a focus on science this year as we plan for the implementation of the new Australian Science syllabus in 2015. Thanks to Mr McGoldrick for organizing the CSIRO Science show about forces (Physics). The students enjoyed the demonstrations and were encouraged to explore the concepts of force, pressure and gravity, and how they affect aspects of everyday life. It's funny how well a student can develop the concept of spreading pressure over a large area when laying on a bed of nails. Through activities like this, Balgownie Public School is working hard to make science come alive for our students.

Grandparents Day is fast approaching! Welcome to Seniors Week. Monday 17th March is the beginning of Seniors Week and we are celebrating with Grandparents Day! 10am is class visits, followed by a BYO picnic lunch with your grandchildren. Teach our students some games that you played at school and enjoy the time spent with our students as they show you how we learn in 2014.

PBS Lesson for this week - Joining in and playing cooperatively Students will require the ability to know

how to 'join in' in a game or activity and how to play cooperatively with their peers. This will provide students with strategies that will be useful when joining in and playing co-operatively.

'Joining in' Activities

- 1. What does it mean to join in? Have students generate as many responses as possible.
- 2. Why is it important to know how to join in?
- 3. Discuss with students possible ways one may ask to join in.

The steps include:

- 1. Greet the other person (use their name and say "Hi", "How are you" etc.).
- 2. Wait for the right time (do not interrupt and make sure they are paying attention).
- 3. Ask to join in (ask using a friendly voice).

Playing Co-operatively Activities

- What does it mean to co-operate? Some examples include:
 - To play together in a fair way.
 - To share, take turns and help each other.

The steps include:

- 1. Decide who starts- flip a coin, roll a dice etc.
- 2. Wait your turn.
- 3. Speak and listen to the other person.
- 4. Say something friendly at the end- 'good game, that was fun' etc.

Students need to be able to apply these understandings in their interactions with each other in their playground games. Please reinforce these at home by talking about what it means to play games fairly and cooperatively; agree on rules, take turns, sharing things, sorting out disagreements, helping and supporting others, good sportsmanship. You can practice these skills when you are playing board games as a family.
