MITZVAH MOBILE FOOD PANTRY



"I'm pregnant, my new job just pays the rent and utilities and a little more, my refrigerator/freezer died and we lost all our food. You can't imagine what a blessing your doing this today is to my family. Thank you so much."

That was only one story, but it made a truly special day even more worthwhile. Together, 60 members of the Jewish community and their friends handed out more than 17,000 pounds of free food to 157 individuals and families who are food insecure. That meant hauling 30 grocery carts from Schnucks, borrowing a fork lift, renting a trailer to haul the fork lift from HyVee, making coffee, putting out the cups and sugar, unconcentrating the orange juice,

displaying the breakfast bars and donut holes, playing the music, assuring the insurance and police

awareness, and securing the induce, assuming the insurance and police awareness, and securing the use of Springfield Clinic's parking lot to keep the Temple B'rith Sholom lot free for the Central Illinois Food Bank truck to unload the apples, onions, cereal, stuffed mushrooms, watermelons and other produce. To qualify, an individual had to give his/her zip code, number in the family, how many seniors and children in the household: that's it.



Families greater than 5 in number got double portions. Each family received a sequential number at check in. While they waited in the TBS Memorial Hall, our hungry neighbors received a warm good morning, orange juice, coffee and pastries/breakfast bars. They gave us courteous thanks, many even bussed their own tables.



At 11 a.m., the first 20 people were called to the drizzly outside parking lot, where some volunteers had unloaded all that food, then handed it out as the recipients went down the line. Each family had a cart, made their choices, and were escorted home if nearby, or to their cars.

Yes, we didn't need to all be there at 8 a.m., which was the Food Bank's idea, and we could have served more people. But for a first effort, it was smoothly run, and as life's experiences so often go, those of us who gave our time, from age 6 to 80+, got more than we gave. Thanks to the **Federation** and **JCRC** for sponsoring this; to **Temple B'rith Sholom** for the use of the building; to **Jordan**

Litvak (a star coordinator), Mary Beth Cohen, Sonia and Ed Gerson, Gary Kessler, Ralph Loewenstein and Steve Stone for serving on the most excellent steering committee; to Rachel Hinkle for creating the sign and

doing all the support work; to **Bank of Springfield** and every Jewish individual and organization who chipped in to cover the costs; to volunteers who bought treats; and to the 60 volunteers who were grinning from ear to ear as they finished their beautiful, wet Shabbat morning.

Let's do it again!



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



The Gail Lieberman President's Award is given to a **Federation Board member** who has given service over and above their standard job description. Thus, it is only awarded from time to time when outstanding work merits this recognition. While the President makes this selection, the staff and other executive members have the opportunity to give

their input as well. This year I was very pleased to present this award at the Federation annual meeting.

One aspect of exceptional contribution is almost never saying no. When asked to attend meetings, chair a committee, participate in future planning—this individual always said yes.

When Israel was attacked from Gaza last summer, the Jewish Federations of North America began fund raising to provide resources to those most vulnerable to attack- including counseling, respite relocation, and provisions for those who couldn't evacuate. We were assigned a specific local Federation goal. This was right before the kickoff of our annual campaign and we had a careful discussion with our campaign chairs. We concluded that we needed to do the special Stop the Sirens appeal and identified the person we hoped might chair it.

I held off calling to make the request because I knew this person was out of town. That evening, I checked my e-mail and discovered a President's dream— brief message from the very same person we had in mind—VOLUNTEERING to chair the special appeal. "I won't be insulted if you want someone else, but I am willing." Volunteering before you are asked is even better than always saying yes!

If you haven't guessed by now, this year's President's Award was given to Barry Seidman. His commitment to our Federation, to our Jewish community, and to the well-being of Israel is almost unmatched. In his modesty, he might claim that he is not eloquent. But on several occasions I have heard him choose just the right words. He presented our community with the analogy of a homeowner, with annual Federation pledges as our mortgage payments to maintain our Jewish home. In the inevitable household emergency—the need for a new roof or repair of storm damage-other funds are needed such as those in a special appeal.

As first vice-president, Barry also has been willing to participate in brainstorming about future planning for the Federation, and he chaired this year's nominating committee. Barry's name has been added to the plaque hanging in the Federation office; I hope many of you will congratulate him on this honor.




