*Electronic licensing surcharge. This licensure fee contains an electronic licensing surcharge. The Minnesota Office of Enterprise Technology (OET) recently sponsored and the Minnesota Legislature passed legislation requiring a 10% surcharge of no less than \$5 and no more than \$150 on each business, commercial, professional or occupational license. The funding from this surcharge will go to OET, which will establish an electronic licensing system for the state. The surcharge will be in place through June 30, 2015.
