IADR ADVANCES RESEARCH

Continuing the mission of advancing research and increasing knowledge for the improvement of oral health worldwide, the International Association for Dental Research (IADR) organized the 9th World Congress on Preventive Dentistry (WCPD), which will feature six plenary and symposium sessions as well as three poster sessions. The objective of the WCPD is to provide an international forum for the presentation and exchange of current information on the prevention of oral diseases and to facilitate the transfer of this information into practice.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Chief Dental Officers, dental public health researchers and administrators, governmental policymakers, NGOs focused on oral health, community directors for public health, prevention-focused health practitioners, and anyone with an interest in promoting oral health for all.

WHY YOU SHOULD ATTEND

Under the theme “Community Actions for Global Alliances for Lifelong Oral Health for All,” the WCPD program will bring together the latest preventive science with domestic and international health policies and best practices for community implementation and evaluation. Particular attention will be paid to involvement of communities and organizations in initiating, planning, implementing and evaluating oral health programs. The WCPD will build on previous declarations and resolutions, such as the WCPD 2005 Liverpool Declaration and the WHO 2007 World Health Assembly Oral Health Resolution, with a bias toward action.

AGREEMENT

Persons submitting an abstract are doing so with the understanding that they will abide by the conditions, deadline policies, and the decisions of the Scientific Review Committee. An individual may submit only one abstract and may present only one paper at the meeting, but may appear as a co-author on other abstracts. Further details are available on the Web site.

Abstracts must not be submitted to the meeting if the work will have been previously published or presented at another meeting prior to the start of this meeting (the paper must be withdrawn if this occurs). If a presentation is later proven to contain previously published materials, appropriate sanctions will be imposed against the author(s), such as prohibiting presentation at an IADR future meeting.

All submitters of accepted abstracts are expected to register for and attend the meeting. If an emergency arises and the presenter is unable to attend, he/she must notify Emily Sidla in writing, *prior to the meeting*, that he/she is withdrawing the abstract or naming a substitute presenter. All notices should be e-mailed to esidla@iadr.org. The substitute must be a co-author and preferably not already presenting another abstract. Failure to follow these procedures may result in the submitter being prohibited from presenting at a future IADR meeting. Please refer to the schedule for poster viewing and presentation times.

GENERAL INFORMATION

TRAVEL INFORMATION

The Phuket International Airport (airport code HKT) is located in the southern part of Thailand (862 kilometers or 517 miles from Bangkok). Phuket International Airport is serviced by 10 airlines (domestic and international) with most flights connecting through Bangkok (less than 1½ hours' flight time). There are several direct flights per day from Singapore to Phuket (1 hour 45 minute flight time) and several direct flights between Phuket and other international destinations, e.g., Kuala Lumpur, Hong Kong, Penang, Singapore, and Sydney. Thai Airways, Dragon Air, Malaysia Airlines, Silk Air and Singapore Airlines service Phuket International Airport.

MEETING LOCATION

The Congress will be held at the Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort & Spa, which is just 33 kilometers (or 20 miles) from the city center of Phuket, Thailand (located on the Andaman seacoast). The Hilton is located 45 minutes away from the Phuket International Airport and is situated on 75 acres next to Karon Beach and surrounded by green mountains. Phuket Fantasea theme park (40-minute drive away) and Chalong Temple (20-minute drive away) are located in the surrounding area.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Taxis between the Hilton Phuket Arcadia Resort & Spa and the airport cost approximately 650 Baht. Minivans charge approximately 180 Baht/person to the Karon Beach areas. Phuket Limousine operates hourly shuttles to the airport from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., and information is available upon arrival at the airport.

WORKING LANGUAGE

The official language of the meeting and all communications will be English.

PASSPORT AND VISAS

Passengers without entry visas (please see "list of countries" section in link below) are able to obtain visas at the arrival counter. A fee of 1000 Baht must be paid, and two one-inch pictures are required. The length of stay is limited.

PRE-REGISTRATION

Pre-registration is strongly advised. Registrations received after the deadline date will be charged the on-site registration fee.

If an e-mail address is supplied, delegates will receive a confirmation letter via e-mail; otherwise your confirmation will be sent via FAX or mail. You will receive a confirmation of registration prior to departing for the meeting. If you pre-register and do not receive a confirmation, please bring a copy of your registration form and proof of payment to the registration desk on site.

Payment must be received at the time of registration. Registration forms received via FAX or the Internet are accepted for individuals paying by credit card only (American Express, MasterCard, or VISA only).

REGISTRATION AND PRESENTER SUBSTITUTIONS

IADR does not allow meeting registration substitutions. Registration fees may not be transferred to another person. Anyone unable to attend the meeting after paying must cancel his/her registration. The registration fee will be refunded if the request is received prior to the cancellation deadline date. The new registrant must then register separately and pay the appropriate registration fee. If you are a substitute presenter, the same policy applies. The original presenter must register for the meeting and then cancel (refund amount will depend on when the cancellation occurs) before the substitution can be processed. The new presenter must then register and pay the applicable rate.
