#### Dr. Larry R. Beuchat Selected as 47th Fred W. Tanner Lecturer

The Tanner Lecture Committee is delighted to announce that Dr. Larry R. Beuchat has been selected as the 2009 Tanner honoree for the Chicago Section IFT.

Dr. Larry Beuchat is a Distinguished Research Professor in the Center for Food Safety and the Department of Food Science and Technology at the University of Georgia. Dr. Beuchat's current research interests include the microbiology of fruits, vegetables, and nuts; methodologies for detecting and enumerating pathogenic bacteria, yeasts, and molds in foods; metabolic stress and injury of foodborne microorganisms; relationships of water activity to microbial growth; and efficacy of disinfection and preservation technologies.

Dr. Beuchat earned a B.S. degree in Horticulture at Pennsylvania State University. His M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in Food Science, with a minor in Microbiology and Public Health, are from Michigan State University. After working in R&D at Quaker Oats Company, he joined the University of Georgia in 1972, where he has devoted his endeavors for decades in the area of food microbiology, safety and protection. Dr. Beuchat's contributions in the field are remarkable. He has written, edited, or co-edited 5 books and authored or co-authored 86 chapters and monographs, 476 refereed scientific journal articles, I I0 miscellaneous scientific publications, and 527 abstracts in the area of microbiological safety and spoilage of foods. He served as an Associate Editor of *Journal of Food Science* from 1989 to 1994 and coeditor of *Journal of Food Protection* from 1994 to 2001, and is a member of the editorial boards of *International Journal of Food Microbiology* and *Food Microbiology*. Dr. Beuchat is a Fellow of the Institute of Food Technologists, International Association for Food Protection, and American Academy of Microbiology.

Recent outbreaks associated with consumption of fresh produce have brought public much attention. Dr. Beuchat has done extensive research in this area to understand the root causes of such illnesses and potential preventive measures. This year we are very fortunate to have Dr. Larry Beuchat as our Tanner Lecture speaker and he will present us a prestigious lecture: "Foodborne Pathogens on Fresh Produce: Getting to Know Them Better". 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#### Fructose Metabolism Complexity Explored

A University of Illinois study suggests that we may pay a price for ingesting too much fructose. According to lead author Manabu Nakamura, dietary fructose affects a wide range of genes in the liver that had not previously been identified.

Many scientists believe that high dietary fructose contributes to the development of metabolic syndrome, a group of risk factors that predict heart disease and Type 2 diabetes.

"For this reason, it's important for scientists to understand exactly how consuming high amounts of fructose affects human health," said Nakamura, associate professor of food science and human nutrition at the University of Illinois.

Because, unlike glucose, fructose metabolism occurs mainly in the liver, Nakamura wanted to gain a complete picture of gene expression in the liver during fructose metabolism.

In Nakamura's study, 24 rats were fed either a 63 percent glucose or fructose diet four hours a day for two weeks; at the end of this period, half the animals fasted for 24 hours before the scientists performed a gene expression analysis; the other half were examined at the end of a four-hour feeding.

Fructose feeding not only induced a broader range of genes than had previously been identified, there were simultaneous increases in glycogen (stored glucose) and triglycerides in the liver.

"We're continuing to assess the risk of fructose insulin resistance and the consequent risk for development of diabetes," he said.

Co-authors of the study, published in a recent issue of Biochimica et Biophysica Acta, are Hyun-Young Koo, Matthew A. Wallig, Takayuki Y. Nara, and B. H. Simon Cho of the University of Illinois and Byung Hong Chung of the University of Alabama at Birmingham.
