Host Family Application – In-home Interview (Part III A & B) Districts: 7120, 7150, 7170, <u>7210</u>

Effective 11/26/2010

Rotary International has directed that all Rotary District Youth Exchange Programs worldwide be certified, be in compliance with RI policy as pertains to programs involving youth, and implement the RI Student Protection Program. In addition, effective 26 Nov 2010, the US Department of State has revised regulations pertaining to the Secondary School Student Exchange program in the United States. Criminal Background Checks are now required for all adult members of Host Families.

Rotary Club YEO – Instructions

The Host Family Application is in three Parts. Parts I & II are the initial forms to be completed by potential Host Families. Part III is completed as part of a personal interview in the potential Host Family home with all family members present.

 Fill-in the top of the Part III Application before meeting with a potential Host Family (Club name & Country)
 You are NOT to provide the family with a copy of the student's application or personal identification information unless they have been vetted. If vetting has not been completed it is suggested you limit verbal discussion to the student's attributes and interests.

3. Part III is to be completed by the YEO at the time of the interview. Do not rely on your memory to fill it in later.

Part III A - Host Family In-home Interview (COMPLETED BY YEO)

- Part III A of the Host Family Application covers the questions to be addressed during the In-home Interview and check of the residence and residential area. It also provides space for the YEO to document reference checks.

Part III B - Host Family Information for Student (COMPLETED BY YEO)

- Part III B contains Host Family, School and Community information that is to be provided to the foreign student and the natural parents 30 days before the student departs from the home country. This Part should be copied or scanned and mailed or e-mailed to the Inbound student and family before the student departs.

Two Rotarians from the host club must conduct the In-home interview with the potential Host Family and request all family members be present. Go over each question with those present and check their response.

Refer to the YEO Host Family Application Instructions for additional guidance and selection criteria.

NOTE: Digital photographs must be taken of the potential Host Family's home and grounds. They should include exterior (front & rear) and grounds, kitchen, student's bedroom, student's bathroom, and the family and student's living areas. The photographs should be taken by the Rotary Club representative and not be provided by the potential host family. They are to be printed and attached to Part III B of the Application. If the family agrees, also take a group picture of the family members present for the interview and attach it.
