Don't think your GPA or financial need is high enough? Think again. A commitment to hospitality is all you need (and a few minimum requirements), and with 8 different scholarships available, there's sure to be at least one that's right for you.

AM I ELIGIBLE?

So, there are a few requirements, but they're pretty basic. Applicants must be enrolled in an undergraduate hospitality-related degree-granting program, with the exception of the Rama and Graduate scholarships, at a U.S. college or university. Qualifying majors include programs such as hotel/restaurant management, culinary arts, travel/tourism, and hotel administration. Each scholarship has additional requirements as well, so be sure to read them all before deciding which ones to apply for.

You'll be evaluated on academics, related work experience, extracurricular activities, financial need, honors, and personal attributes, but we're not looking for a "cookie cutter" profile.

IS IT WORTH MY TIME?

With eight scholarship programs and more than \$860,000 to hand out to a few hundred recipients, it's never been easier to get tuition money. Scholarship awards range from \$500 to \$6,000, and unlike a loan, that money never needs to be paid back.

It only takes a few minutes to apply. Wouldn't you say it's worth your time?

IF THAT'S NOT ENOUGH, YOU GET MORE.

Awardees of an AH&LEF scholarship receive a free membership to the American Hotel & Lodging Association (AH&LA), planting you at the center of the industry with access to all the news, information, and events on which the nation's leading hotel companies rely. It keeps you in the know and in touch with the individuals who make the hiring decisions. You also receive an exclusive opportunity to join the AH&LEF's Alumni Group, a close-knit group of scholarship awardees who act as vital connections down the road. If you are under 30 years of age you'll also be able to join AH&LA's newest membership category, the Under 30 Gateway, which includes a mentor program.

SO LET'S GET STARTED.

Our scholarships fall into two categories: **self-nominated** and **school-nominated**. For self-nominated scholarships, you assess which ones you qualify for and then indicate the ones for which you want to receive consideration. (Your school does not have to be affiliated with AH&LEF.) If you've been notified by a faculty member that you've been nominated by your school, be sure to check the appropriate box under "school-nominated" scholarships, as well as indicate any other self-nominated ones you're interested in.

Just remember, the application deadline is May 1.

Self-Nominated Scholarships

INCOMING FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was created exclusively for incoming freshman to encourage enrollment in hospitality-related undergraduate programs and attract more students to the lodging industry. The program is funded from the PepsiCo Foundation Scholarship Fund, proceeds from the Americas Lodging Investment Summit (ALIS), and scholarship monies set aside from AH&LEF's New Century Fund Campaign.

Pepsico Foundation



The PepsiCo Foundation made a \$250,000 contribution through AH&LEF's New Century Fund

Campaign in 2001, creating the PepsiCo Foundation Scholarships. The fund has focused on encouraging incoming freshman to study hospitality. To-date, 54 students have received scholarships totaling \$123,000.

ALIS

The Americas Lodging Investment Summit (ALIS), which is co-owned by AH&LA and Burba Hotel Network, has allocated a generous portion of its revenues to benefit the

educational, research, and training missions of AH&LEF. Since its inception, ALIS has provided scholarships for 1,207 students in 120 schools across the country, generated more than \$2.3 million for cutting-edge research projects, and afforded funding for the START program in more than 358 high schools and work force training centers as well as for the Lodging Management and the new Hospitality & Tourism Management Programs in 518 high schools.

New Century Fund Campaign

The unprecedented success of the New Century Fund Campaign, which closed in November 2011, showed the industry's strong commitment to meeting its challenges and seizing its



opportunities. The campaign raised more than \$9 million for scholarships, school-to-career programs, career outreach and workforce development, support for the American Hotel & Lodging Educational Institute, and technology research.

Awards: Baccalaureate Majors - \$4,000 Associate Majors - \$2,000

Eligibility:

- An incoming freshman for the upcoming fall semester, which is defined as a student who has never been enrolled in a college or university
- An undergraduate hospitality management major at a U.S. college or university
- Enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for the upcoming fall and spring semesters
- A minimum overall GPA of 2.0
- A U.S. citizen or permanent U.S. resident

GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

After receiving many requests for graduate scholarships, AH&LEF began offering a scholarship exclusively for graduate students in 2008. The program is funded by proceeds generated by the Americas Lodging Investment Summit (ALIS).

Awards: \$5,000

Eligibility:

- If your graduate degree is in anything other than a hospitality-related program, you must have either:
 - An undergraduate degree in hospitality
 - Four years' employment in the lodging industry after graduation
- **OR** if you do not have either of the above, then you must be enrolled in a hospitality-related graduate degree
- Enrollment can be full- or part-time in a U.S. college or university
- A minimum overall GPA of 3.0
- A U.S. citizen or permanent U.S. resident

THE HYATT HOTELS FUND FOR MINORITY LODGING MANAGEMENT STUDENTS



In 1988, Hyatt established this fund to provide financial aid to minority students pursuing a degree in hotel

management. Since its inception, approximately 351 minority students have received \$702,000 through this scholarship.

- Enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for the upcoming fall and spring semesters, or just the fall semester if graduating this December

THE ECOLAB SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

This program was established by Ecolab in 1996 as a commitment to



the lodging industry and to support the development of its future leaders. To date, more than \$401,650 has been awarded to 269 hospitality management students.

AMERICAN EXPRESS SCHOLARSHIP



Founded by American Express in 1994, this program is designed specifically for current lodging employees and their dependents. Endowed with more than \$500,000, the fund has awarded \$357,000 in scholarships to 311 students and professionals.

Associate Majors:

\$1,000 full-time enrollment, or \$500 part-time

Eligibility:

 - Be working a minimum of 20 hours per week at an AH&LA member hotel with at least 12 months' hotel experience, OR

ARTHUR J. PACKARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION



This scholarship honors Arthur J. Packard, a third-generation hotelier, who's work for AH&LA extended over 30 years -- one of the longest on record.

The Packard Competition provides scholarships to the most outstanding

student of lodging management and to two runners-up through an annual competition among Foundation affiliated four-year programs. Each university nominates its bestqualified student to compete. THE RAMA SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE AMERICAN DREAM



JHM Hotels, Inc. established the Rama Scholarship for the American Dream with a \$1,000,001 endowment. The five Rama brothers, principals in the company, emigrated from India to pursue their American Dream. It began with the ownership of one lodging property and grew into a successful operation of 35 properties and more than 1,500 associates. The fund, established on the 25th anniversary of the brothers' first hotel purchase, encourages others to create their own American Dream. Since its inception in 1998, the Rama Scholarship Fund has awarded \$726,000 in scholarships to 446 recipients.

Award: \$500 - \$3,000 depending upon enrollment and recommended amount from school

Eligibility:

- Enrolled in at least 9 credit hours for upcoming fall and spring semesters, or just the fall semester if graduating in December
- An undergraduate or graduate hospitality management major
- A minimum overall GPA of 2.5
- A U.S. citizen or permanent U.S. resident
- Participating schools select the recipients. Preference is given to students of Asian-Indian descent and other minority groups, as well as JHM Hotel employees

Professional Development Scholarships

Even if you're not enrolled in a college or university, AH&LEF can still help you fund your educational pursuits. INSTRUCTIONS AND POLICIES

- Applicants must be enrolled in an undergraduate hospitality-related degree-granting program, with the exception of the Rama and Graduate scholarships, at a U.S. college or university.
- Full-time enrollment for all scholarships is defined as enrollment of 12 or more credit hours for both the upcoming fall and spring semesters. Part-time is considered less than 12 credit hours for one or both semesters, or full-time enrollment for fall semester only.
- Self-nominated scholarships do not require school nomination in order to be considered. School-nominated scholarships do require school nomination for consideration.
- It's important that applicants complete all required sections of the application because they are scored on a combination of academic performance, hospitality work experience, financial need, extracurricular/professional activities, and honors, as well as personal attributes as defined in their career goal statement.
- Students who receive an award are paid in two equal installments per academic year. The first check is mailed in September and the second in December. Checks are issued jointly to the student and the school and must be endorsed by both. The scholarship checks and certificates are sent directly to the university. Scholarships must be used exclusively for the payment of tuition, fees, and books. Any remaining funds must be returned to AH&LEF. Any recipient who fails to meet the enrollment criteria or cancels his/her enrollment must notify AH&LEF immediately.
