Public Input Process for How to Finance Sand Replenishment Along City Beaches. City Council assigned City of Virginia Beach Beaches &Waterway Advisory Commission this mission. Public meetings were held 1, 15, 29 Aug, 25 Sep; another is scheduled for 17 Oct to be held at the City Managers Conference Room. Commission is now gathering information from civic and business leaders. A Croatan Civic League (CCL) position statement was submitted and discussed at the 26 Sep meeting. A Croatan Beach sand replenishment Special Service District is unlikely. An interim Committee letter report to Council has been forwarded. Lake Christine Conservation

We in Croatan pride ourselves in our neighborly manners. We may want to consider Lake Christine as one of our neighbors in need of a helping hand. As our properties are an intermixing of manmade and natural components, so is Lake Christine. Manmade lakes face challenges in remaining productive, especially in developed locations like Croatan and other surrounding areas. As we begin to see the results of the study of Lake Christine, we will present information and opportunities for contributing to the health of this beautiful entity that makes Croatan such a serene and bountiful place for both humans and wildlife.

One of the issues affecting our lake is the debris and chemicals which enter the lake. This leads to sedimentation filling the lake, too-rich nutrients causing algal blooms and toxic substances poisoning plants and animals.

This month, let's look at what we can do together and individually to make a difference in controlling a bit of debris entering and choking our neighborhood. Right now, there are a lot of leaves and pine needles falling. When they fall in the



road, rain can funnel them into the storm drains heading straight into Lake Christine. A very small area



(about 60 feet) of Fort Raleigh Drive took only 10 minutes to rake and yielded 2 bags of pine needles and 1 bag of leaves. Imagine the amount of

debris we could prevent from entering Lake Christine if we would all rake and bag what falls on the roads in front of, or



adjacent to, our homes. If your yard doesn't have debris, perhaps you could identify an area that does and adopt it for clean-up (such as areas of Croatan Road and its bike path or any area in need of clean-up). Of course, BE CAREFUL of traffic when working in the road and wear bright and visible clothing.

A nice benefit of this activity is a natural, <u>local</u> mulch or ground covering for your (or a neighbor's) yard. I plan on lining areas with leaves (for compost) and covering them with pine straw for a chemical-free (and cost-free!) landscaping tool. Even bagging for city pick-up is better than letting it go down the drain.

We in Croatan are friendly neighbors, reaching out to those who need support. Let's come together to give a hand to a big, wet neighbor that gives us so much joy. Lake Christine needs <u>YOU</u> to stay healthy!

Wildlife in Croatan by Susanna H. Miller



In honor of Lake Christine, let's look at one of the many creatures that call her home. While snakes may not be a favorite creature of some folks, they are valuable in the control of rodent populations and seldom cause any harm. With the easy access of the internet for identification and information, there is no need for the unnecessary killing of any non-venomous snake and venomous snakes should be left to the experts for removal.

The Northern Water Snake, *Nerodia sipedon*, is probably the snake most confused with, and, unfortunately, often killed for resembling a water moccasin. This harmless snake can reach 55 inches long and is quite thick around the middle. It also has powerful jaws and the muscular head can be confused for that of a venomous snake although it does not have the angular head of either a water moccasin or copperhead. They can have splotches or bands which are more noticeable in small or wet specimens and can be brown, tan or grayish (as with any snake they can be almost white and have white eyes - really a coating of skin - when they are getting ready to shed, see photo above). These reptiles feed mainly on amphibians and fish and give birth to live young. Another fascinating neighbor to learn to understand and appreciate in Croatan!

Aquarium Adventure Park Opening Summer 2014

Virginia's Largest "Aerial Forest Park" is part of Owls Creek Master Plan



The Virginia Aquarium will open Virginia's largest "aerial forest park" in early summer and, in fall 2014. This is a joint project between the Virginia Aquarium & Marine Science Center, Virginia Beach Parks & Recreation and the Outdoor Venture Group. Appealing to outdoor funseekers ages 5 and up, the Adventure Park, located on the campus of the Virginia Aquarium, will feature multiple zip lines and aerial ropes challenge courses. Activities at the park are forest-friendly, requiring only human power—no motors or machines.

The Adventure Park at Virginia Aquarium is designed, built and operated by the Outdoor Venture Group, the leading authority in the United States on aerial forest parks and largely responsible for bringing this increasingly popular activity to the United States from Europe, where it originated. The Group has designed and built nearly a dozen other Adventure Parks throughout the United States for its clients.



- Bridge between Christine Drive and Secotan Road*




Recycle Household Batteries
