NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Township of Byram, that the public shall be excluded from discussion of the following matters:



<u>SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER</u> – Eileen Swan from New Jersey Conservation Foundation (NJCF) – Easement Monitoring Program

The foundation is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to preserve New Jersey's land and natural resources. Eileen Swan presented a 30-minute power point presentation about the Easement Monitoring Program. Eileen announced that this was not going to cost Byram Township any money. The NJCF was working with several different funding sources to obtain the resources to do this

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#### program.

Easements are legally binding agreements between a municipality and a landowner that allow the township to maintain the rights to a portion of the property. Eileen Swan said to think of the property as a bundle of sticks. "The whole bundle is a property, but the township owns just one of the sticks and can decide how they want to conserve it," Swan said. "The point is to protect the environmental assets of the community."

She said the reason conservation easements are put in place is for the township to protect any sensitive environmental areas such as surface waters, wetlands, steep slopes, ridge lines, hill crests and flood plains.

Eileen Swan outlined what the foundation's easement monitoring program would bring to the township:

- Creating a database and maps of all easements, which would enable everyone to see where these easements are in town and also why they are there.

- Making a community profile.

- Community outreach, which would help people understand the value of these easements. "We need people to understand the values of these easements."

- Landowner outreach, which would educate people who come to live in Byram about these easements on their properties."

- Status of easements, and most important, the monitoring of the easements. Easements should be checked yearly and address any issues.

- Model Documents - Eileen Swan said all future easements would have the same language in the contracts and would be mapped out as soon as they are acquired.

Councilwoman Marie Raffay questioned what the township would end up with if the council decided to move forward with the project. Eileen Swan said the township would have all the documents and maps for all the easements both physically and electronically and that the foundation would provide the township with the methodology to do all of it.

Councilman Scott Olson said the township had worked with Eileen Swan on various projects on and off for the last nine years while she was the executive director of the New Jersey Highlands Council. She said through her previous work with the township, she gained understanding of the township's master plan and ordinances that have been put in place because of the vision that the Township Council, Planning and Zoning boards, and Environmental Commission have for the future.

Scott Olson said the program will not be in place overnight and that during the time it takes to implement it, the program could be tailored to the township's needs.

"The town has been a beautiful area for over 200 years," Swan said. "I think working with the easement program will help keep it that way."

The Mayor thanked Eileen for the presentation and asked what she was looking for tonight. Eileen stated that she wanted the Council's approval to move forward on this project. Councilman Olson made a motion, second by Councilwoman Raffay, to continue this process and move forward to the next necessary steps to start this easement monitoring program with the NJ Conservation Foundation.


- Attended the Dare Graduation and spoke to the 5<sup>th</sup> graders. Officer Marcus Lisa does a great job teaching the program.
