Second, thanks to Laura Meadows for trading me the free show season she won (she said she didn't have her own horse) for the Janice Dulak Pilates classes I won but could not attend due to a scheduling conflict.

That whole situation was really weird because before the banquet I told my friend and current trainer, Tracy Bregman, that I was probably going to come home with a free show season. After all, I hadn't been to a show in 8 years and have had one lesson and about two dozen rides in the last 6 years. Since I moved to Ocala from Naples 3 years ago I have been volunteering at the STRIDE shows, not riding in them! Much to my delight and, admittedly, dread, I did come home with that free show season.

RECIPE: PORK CHOPS WITH GRAPES

Ingredients:

4-6 (3/4 inch thick) pork chops
1 cup dry white wine or chicken broth
Dash paprika
8 oz green seedless grapes (halved), about 1.5 cups
1 Tbsp butter
1 Tbsp vegetable oil

1. Trim pork chops, making a few short cuts at the edges so they will lie flat. Season with salt and pepper to taste; sprinkle with paprika on both sides.

2. Heat the butter and oil in a large skillet over Med. heat. Brown chops on both sides: do not crowd chops.

3. Add wine to skillet and reduce heat to low. Cover" simmer gently for 10 minutes or until the chops are no longer pink or until juices run clear (170 degrees for well done). Remove chops to a warm platter, keep warm.

4. Add grapes to skillet. Cook for about 3 minutes while stirring. Pour grape sauce over the chops.

Serves 4 or 6 depending on the number of chops.

May you find Balance, Order, Rhythm and Harmony as you flow through your days in and out of the saddle.

And intensity? Well, a little bit may be OK, but haven't we all fallen into the Intensity Trap? Take a deep breath. Breathe in, breathe out, do it again. Be happy!

JUDGE'S CORNER

Three points have come up about our judges in the past few months. I'd like to explain so there is less confusion.

"Judges are not allowed to compete as Adult Amateurs." False!

If you teach, train, or ride a horse for payment in any division, you are considered a professional. However, adult amateurs may become "L" graduates and proceed up the ladder of judging cards, too. In some Western Divisions (non-USEF), judges are deemed professionals, but, the Western Dressage Association of American is currently using USDF/USEF Dressage judges--and, we can be either professional or amateur.

"Judges can't be competitors." True and False!

They can't compete in a show where they are judging. As a licensed judge, though, I can judge one weekend and compete the next. I can also compete for year end awards Nationally, against people that I have given scores to. I'm not going to say whether I think that's a good or bad idea--but, it is the current system. STRIDE has at least three judges this year who are competing at other STRIDE shows. Unlike recognized shows, we do try to keep each one away from judging the classes in which they normally compete. A STRIDE manager may compete also. We learned a while back that, if you restrict using knowledgeable competitors from volunteering, you delete a good pool of workers.

"I take lessons from that judge, so, I can't be judged by her/him." False—in a schooling show.

Most judges will tell you it doesn't matter and it almost never gives the student an advantage. (They know the student's biggest problems!) In a recognized situation, the student may not take a lesson within 30 days of the show. The 30 day rule also holds for boarding in a judge's barn. Buying, selling, or leasing a horse that involves a judge extends the time to 90 days. As judges, we do try to keep from judging people that we have a professional partnership with. In a perfect world, the judges don't know anyone who comes in front of them. That would mean we'd have to pay a lot of travel expenses (hotels, meals...). That would mean taking a chance on an unknown judge, who might not be easy to work with. Paying airfare from California, frankly, isn't in the budget. All of our judges have gone through extensive programs to help keep the standard of Dressage correct and positive. Ask any "L" grad how "easy" it was to make that first step (NOT!). We judge because we like it, even when being honest doesn't give the highest scores. When we do see the 9's and 10's, it's awesome! END




