 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Space Preservation Act5 of 2002".

Congress reaffirms the policy expressed in section
102(a) of the National Aeronautics and Space Act of 1958
(42 U.S.C. 2451(a)), stating that it "is the policy of the
United States that activities in space should be devoted
to peaceful purposes for the benefit of all mankind.".

8 SEC. 3. BAN ON BASING OF WEAPONS IN SPACE AND THE

9 USE OF WEAPONS AGAINST OBJECTS IN 10 SPACE IN ORBIT.

11 The President shall—

(1) implement a ban on space-based weapons of
the United States and the use of weapons of the
United States to destroy or damage objects in space
that are in orbit; and

16 (2) immediately order the termination of re17 search and development, testing, manufacturing,
18 production, and deployment of all space-based weap19 ons of the United States.

20 SEC. 4. INTERNATIONAL TREATY BANNING SPACE-BASED

21 WEAPONS AND THE USE OF WEAPONS
22 AGAINST OBJECTS IN SPACE IN ORBIT.

23 The President shall direct the United States rep24 resentatives to the United Nations and other international
25 organizations to immediately work toward negotiating,

3 SEC. 5. REPORT.

4 The President shall submit to Congress not later than
5 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, and
6 every 6 months thereafter, a report on—

7 (1) the implementation of the ban on space8 based weapons and the use of weapons to destroy or
9 damage objects in space that are in orbit required
10 by section 3; and

(2) progress toward negotiating, adopting, andimplementing the treaty described in section 4.

13 SEC. 6. SPACE-BASED NONWEAPONS ACTIVITIES.

14 Nothing in this Act may be construed as prohibiting15 the use of funds for—

- 16 (1) space exploration;
- 17 (2) space research and development;

(3) testing, manufacturing, or production that
is not related to space-based weapons or systems; or
(4) civil, commercial, or defense activities (including communications, navigation, surveillance, reconnaissance, early warning, or remote sensing) that
are not related to space-based weapons or systems.

24 SEC. 7. DEFINITIONS.

25 In this Act:

(1) The term "space" means all space extend-
ing upward from an altitude greater than 60 kilo-
meters above the surface of the earth and any celes-
tial body in such space.
(2) The terms "space-based weapon" and
"space-based system" mean a device capable of dam-
aging or destroying an object or person (whether in
outer space, in the atmosphere, or on earth) by—
(A) firing one or more projectiles to collide
with that object or person;
(B) detonating one or more explosive de-
vices in close proximity to that object or person;
(C) directing a source of energy against
that object or person; or
(D) any other undeveloped means.

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
