Nonqualified Plan Design and Administration

After delaying the effective date of the final 409A regulations and also the deadline to amend plans to comply with the regulations, the IRS is finally bringing the gavel down. The final regulations are lengthy and complex. They will require rethinking – and almost surely rewriting – every nonqualified plan, including many arrangements which the parties did not view as deferred compensation plans. The deadline for plan amendments is December 31, 2008.

This must-attend program addresses the final 409A regulations, including 409A exemptions, deferral timing, payment elections and changes, reporting, and documentation. Compensation – Legislative and regulatory history, constructive receipt, economic benefit doctrine, Code Section 83, top-hat exemption, funding.

Distribution Requirements – Distribution events, specified employee, unforeseeable emergency, change of control, specified time (date vs. event), disability, plan termination, multiple distribution events or timing, adding distribution events.

Funding Requirements – Vested deferred compensation, rabbi trusts, offshore funding, exceptions, employer's financial health, application to grandfathered amounts.

Withholding and Reporting Requirements – W-2 and 1099-R reporting of deferrals, distributions, timing of taxation.

Penalty Provisions – Current year taxation, interest, 20% additional tax, employer sanctions, plan document failure, correction under Notice 2007-100.

Written Document Requirement – Mandatory provisions, optional provisions, deadlines, strategies, amendments.

Effective Date/Grandfather Rules/
Transitional Rules – Effective dates of statute and regulations, grandfather rule, material modifications, amendment deadline, good-faith compliance, special transition rules for final regulations.

457(f) (Ineligible) Plans – Code Section 409A requirements, substantial risk of forfeiture.
