



Introduction

Character Bio Reports are an easy yet effective way to encourage students to write an original report on a famous person or character. Instead of copying facts and rewording them to write a report, students research the person's accomplishments and use that information to write a short character analysis. In the process, students deepen their understanding of character trait terms. This assignment is so flexible that it can be used several times during the year by focusing on different characters. Included in the packet are five different variations of this activity, but you can easily create your own variations.

Character Bio Teacher Information

The Character Bio Report lesson will take several days to a week depending on how much class time you devote to the project. This packet contains a variety of direction pages and graphic organizers, but it's not necessary to duplicate them all. The only handout that your students must have is a copy of the directions. All other materials can be displayed on a projector or recreated with a foldable or homemade graphic organizer.

Lesson Suggestions

- 1. Introducing the Lesson Choose the focus of your assignment. You can use the basic Character Bio directions on page 3 and leave it completely open-ended, or you can use one of the specialized direction pages at the end of this packet. Write in your assignment deadline and duplicate one copy for each student. If you plan to use the Character Bio Rubric on page 10 to assess their reports, display a copy of the rubric and explain it to your students.
- 2. **Brainstorming** After you present the assignment, give some class time for brainstorming topics. It's strongly suggested that you approve their choices before they begin researching their topic. To make this easy, use the Topic Approval Slips on page 4.
- 3. **Researching** Give students a copy of the Research Notes page on page 5, or have them take notes on their own paper. Remind them to record their sources if you plan to have them report their sources later. If possible, arrange for them to have computer time or research time in the Media Center.
- 4. **Choosing Character Traits** Display the Character Traits list on page 6 or give each student a copy. Discuss the meanings of unfamiliar words and have them select three character traits that describe their person. Remind them that they must have details from their research to support their choices.
- 5. **Organizing Ideas** Before they begin writing, your students need to learn how to organize their ideas. You can use one of the two graphic organizers on pages 7 and 8 or have them create their own graphic organizer. They should write one character trait at the top of each section and list supporting details under that trait.
- 6. Writing the Report When students are ready to write, introduce them to the 5-paragraph essay format shown on the Character Bio Rocket (page 9). Explain what they need to include in each part of their report. After they write their rough drafts, post the Character Bio Rocket again and ask them to review their papers to see if they have included all necessary information.
- 7. **Assessing the Report** To use the rubric on page 10, assess each aspect of the paper by assigning it a value from 1 (low) to 5 (high). Total the points and use the scale at the bottom to assign a letter grade.







Character Bio Report

What character traits are demonstrated by people who excel in their professions and achieve greatness? To find out, you'll research one person, past or present, whom you admire. You'll discover facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized around that person's character traits. Following the steps below will ensure a dynamite report!

Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of people you admire. They may be living now or have lived long ago. Consider presidents, inventors, civil rights leaders, teachers, writers, or community members. Then choose one person as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research Character

Research your character using a wide variety of resources. If the person is someone you know, try to arrange an interview. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Train

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

ganize your ideac before writing. Write your three character traits, and der each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that gives brief biographical information. The body should include at least three paragraphs, one paragraph per character trait. Conclude with a paragraph that explains why you selected this person or offers some reflection on the person's accomplishments and impact on society. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

During the month of February, we often honor our Presidents. This month you'll be researching one President and writing a short report. You'll choose one President, past or present, whom you admire. Then you'll research facts about his life experiences and accomplishments and use this information to write a short report organized around his character traits. Following the steps below will ensure a dynamite report!



Brainstorm a list of Presidents you admire. They may be living now or have lived long ago. You may have to do a little research before you can make your selection. Then choose one President as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research President

Research this President using a variety of resources. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character. You'll also need to record basic background information about that President.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the President's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

ep 4: Organize Ideas

ganize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and idea each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction followed by at least one paragraph on each of the three character traits you selected. Show that President demonstrates each character trait. Conclude with a paragraph that explains why you selected this President or a reflection on his accomplishments. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

Scientist/Inventor Bio Report

Over the past centuries, scientists and inventors have been responsible for huge changes in our society. Their accomplishments, discoveries, and inventions have revolutionized the way we live, travel, communicate, and store information. What character traits are demonstrated by people whose lives have such tremendous impact? To find out, you'll research one scientist or inventor, past or present, whom you admire.



You'll discover facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized around that person's character traits. Following the steps below will ensure a dynamite report!

Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of scientists or inventors, past or present, that you admire. You may want to think of an invention or discovery important to you and write about the inventor or scientist responsible for that discovery.

Step 2: Research Scientist or Inventor

Research your scientist or inventor using a wide vanety of resources. You'll need a few basic facts about the invention or discovery, but you should focus your research on the person behind the discovery. If the person is someone you know, try to arrange an interview Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Trait

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that includes background information about the invention or discovery. The body of your paper should include at least three paragraphs, one paragraph for each character trait. Conclude with a brief paragraph that explains why you chose this scientist or a reflection on the person's accomplishments. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

You'll discover facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized around that person's character traits. Following the steps below will ensure a dynamite report!

Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of historical figures that you admire. You may need to do some research before you are able to make your selection. Then choose one person to use as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research Historical Figure

Research your historical figure using a wide variety of resources. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this persont Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

ep 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that includes background information about the major contributions of this historical figure. The body of your paper should include at least three paragraphs, one paragraph per character trait. Conclude with a brief paragraph that explains why you chose this historical figure or a reflection on the person's accomplishments. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

What character traits are demonstrated by these individuals who have had such a positive impact on others? To find out, you'll be researching a Black American and writing a short report in the form of a character analysis. You'll choose HA

one Black American, past or present, whom you admire. Then you'll research facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments. You'll use this information to write a short report organized around his or her character traits. Following the steps below will ensure a dynamite report!

Step 1: Select a Black American

Brainstorm a list of Black Americans you admire. They may be living now or have lived long ago. You may have to do a little research before you can make your selection. Then choose one perion as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research and Record Facts

Research this person using a variety of resources. Begin by recording basic background information about your person. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Trait

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction followed by at least three paragraphs, one paragraph per character trait. Book Gharacter Bio Report

Think of a book character whom you admire or with whom you can identify. What traits are demonstrated by this character? To find out, you'll gather details about that character's words and actions, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized around that character's traits. Following the steps below will ensure a dynamite report!

Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of book characters you admire. Start by thinking of your favorite books and the important characters in those books. Then choose one character as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Identify Character Traits

Based on your reading, what character traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that you you'll be able to justify with evidence from the text.

Step 3: Find Supporting Details

Find a copy of the book where you were first introduced to this character. Scan the text to find clues about the character's traits. Look for the character's actions, his or her words, and the descriptions given by the author. Continue scanning and recording theas until you have listed at least 8 to 10 details that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and nder each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information you gathered. Start with an introduction in which you identify the book's title and author as well as the character you have chosen to analyze. Include a one-sentence summary of the book's plot. In the body of your paper, write at least three more paragraphs, one paragraph about each trait. Conclude with a brief paragraph explaining why you chose to write about this person and what you can learn from the character. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.
