2006 SR-6N Conclave April 21st to 23rd At Camp Eudora, MS

On April 21st to 23rd we will once again be participating in the Section SR-6N Conclave. This year's Conclave is hosted by Ahoalan-Nachpikin Lodge #558 at Camp Eudora in Mississippi. Conclave is a weekend of training, competition and fellowship with Arrowmen from Mississippi, Tennessee and Kentucky. We are going to be taking a charter bus to and from Conclave this year. The bus has already been booked and will seat fifty two people. To ensure your spot on the bus and to get the best price for Conclave you need to get your registration in now. The cost for this year's Conclave is \$45.00 if paid by March 12th, \$50.00 if paid

before April 15th and \$55.00 thereafter. This fee includes both the transportation fee for the

Conclave are not included in this fee, so be sure to bring money. This is the first time we have ever traveled to Conclave by bus as a group and it promises to be a fun trip. Patch Collector's Corner

In this edition's patch collector's corner we will discuss some of the rules involved in patch trading.

As a general rule trades are only supposed to take place between people of your own age group (youth to youth and adult to adult), this is for the protection of traders of both groups. Another rule to know is that BSA regulations prohibit the trading of badges of rank and recognition. A third rule which is actually a guideline is to trade one for one when possible. This allows both parties to feel the exchange was fair and no one feels cheated. A fourth rule, is do not be afraid to say no to a

trade, if you feel it is not a fair trade then do not make it. Finally remember this is Scouting and Scouts are supposed to be fair and honest in their dealings.
