Also, TalligiCards are available at the price of \$60. This is a fantastic deal as it includes your yearly dues and admission to all of the Lodge events throughout the year. This is a savings of \$21 to participate in all of the events for the year and guarantees you all of the event patches as well. There

Health & Safety Announcement by Josh Simpson

This is a reminder that all members of the Lodge must have a completed Lodge Medical Form on file with the Health and Safety Committee in order to participate in any Lodge event. This includes Ordeal weekends, Conclave and any training weekends. The rationale behind this requirement is that it is BSA policy that in order for a person to participate in an

event of seventy two hours or less that they must have a Class 1 Medical Form or it's equivalent completed and signed by a parent or guardian if they are under the age of eighteen. It is recommended that Lodge members complete the medical form and return it with their dues form each year. Ordeal Candidates should have received a medical form at the time of

their callout and should bring it with them to their Ordeal. A copy of the Lodge Medical form can be found on page six of this newsletter. 
New & Improved Lodge Website Launched


The new site features much of our favorite content from

There Is Still Time To Have Your Unit Election




It is that time of year again and Unit Elections are in full swing for the 2008 season. If your unit has not yet scheduled their Unit Election be sure to contact the Lodge Unit Election Committee so that they can schedule your troop's election date. Once this is done, a representative from the Lodge in your district will come to your meeting and conduct the Unit Election. These elections, are what produce our future Arrowmen and leaders, so it

is important to get your election done today.

The requirements for youth membership into the Order of the Arrow are BSA membership, 15 days and nights of camping (6 of which must include a resident camp, 1st Class Rank, Scoutmaster Approval, and they have to be elected by the troop. The requirements for Adult membership into the Order are BSA membership, their membership will be beneficial to the Order, selected by the

Unit after a successful election of youth candidates, along with the aforementioned camping requirements only 1 adult per unit per 50 youth members, and approval of the Lodge. NOAC Is Coming To IU In 2009

Are you looking for an event that is full of fun and fellowship? If so, then the National Order of the Arrow Conference is for you. The National Order of the Arrow Conference, known as NOAC for short, is the biggest OA event that exists attracting Arrowmen from all over the United States. It is held every other year on the campus of a major university, most recently at Michigan State University in 2006. In 2009, NOAC will be held at Indiana University in Bloomington, IN, which is

the site of the first NOAC that was held in 1948. NOAC is a week long event that is full of training, nightly arena shows, patch trading, and endless amounts of fun. The 2009 NOAC will be held August 1st-6th, 2009 with an estimated cost of \$350. A \$100 deposit is required for a seat in our contingency and in order for our Lodge to take as many people as possible, it is important to get your reservation in today! You can do this by sending in \$50 to the Lodge to save your spot with the remainder of the deposit being due by December

31st, 2008. This is the closest that a National Conference will ever get to home and we want you to be a part of this awesome experience! 
