Oxford feeds the mind, as teachers have a chance to return to graduate school. The Globe engages, body, soul and mind on the South Bank of the Thames. These 45 teacher-scholars could take summer course in the US. It's not the same. The ESU offers an opportunity that is exceptional. We should all be proud of this program.

The BUSS program is an expensive investment, but an important one. Please stretch and raise the funds and extend the outreach into your community. Your teachers and students will be grateful. Don't just take my word for it, Megan King, ESU New Orleans 2014 BUSS Scholar shared:

Our experience at The Globe was unbelievably phenomenal. The performance-based methods used by The Globe practitioners will keep my students actively engaged and will enrich their experiences with both Shakespearean and other texts. Please know that the ESUUS and the TSTP program have benefitted not only 25 teachers this year, but also countless students for many years to come.

This autumn, Megan and 45 ESU BUSS Scholars returned to their schools across the country with their skills recharged and armed with new knowledge and teaching methods to connect, engage and challenge over 4,300 students nationwide. Many other teachers reached out to ESU National Headquarters eager to apply for a BUSS Fellowship, but had to postpone their professional goals as there was not a participating ESU Branch in their community. Now is the chance for your Branch to make their educational goals a reality and impact the quality of education in your community.

#### **Recommended Guidelines**

Once your ESU Branch has decided to confer a BUSS Fellowship, select a BUSS Coordinator and assemble a Fellowship Selection Committee.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR BUSS FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE:**

- The BUSS Fellowship Competition should be composed of a minimum of three people, including one with professional academic experience, if possible.
- BUSS Alum and National Shakespeare Competition Committee members or judges are encouraged to be members of the BUSS committee.
- The committee should include at least one ESU Board Member.
- Any BUSS Fellowship Committee member affiliated with a candidate's school should remove themselves from the final selection process.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR ESU BUSS FELLOWSHIP TEACHER SELECTION:**

Teachers who will have the greatest impact and most benefit from an ESU BUSS Fellowship:

- Mid-career, full-time teachers with 5 15 years teaching experience
- Teachers who work in schools with a significant number of underserved students
- Teachers who have not studied overseas or participated in extended professional development
- English Language Arts/Literature teachers are preferred (for the Globe's *Teaching Shakespeare Through Performance*)
- The BUSS Fellowship Competition must be advertised to public and secondary schools in the area the Branch targets for the program. It may also be open to independent and parochial school teachers.
- Branches should strive to award BUSS Fellowships to teachers from different schools each year and to avoid any conflict of interests.

#### **Time Line**

**November 1, 2014** BUSS Participation Form returned to ESU National Headquarters.

Branch updates template BUSS application forms and post on Branch website. Email local teachers with Branch deadline.

November 15, 2014 UK Institution brochures mailed as soon as ESU National

Headquarters receives them from the UK -- usually November for

Edinburgh and December for Oxford and The Globe.

**January-February** BUSS Fellowship Interviews conducted. Time and Place TBA.

**February 15, 2015** BUSS Fellowships awarded. Please inform Fellowship recipients to

download the application of the program they wish to attend, complete all requirements and send to ESU National Headquarters.

March 1, 2015 Completed applications due at ESU National Headquarters.

International Programs Manager reviews and forwards all

applications to the UK.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Most ESU BUSS Scholarship recipients are accepted into their first

choice program. However, these programs have limited availability. The Globe is extremely competitive. **Final acceptance is determined** 

and notified by the UK institution, not the ESU.

Early April BUSS Fellows, ESU National Headquarters and ESU Branch contacts

are notified directly by UK institution in early April of their BUSS Fellows' acceptance via e-mail. Once ESU BUSS Fellows have been accepted by the UK institution, ESU-US pays the UK Institution and invoices the Branches for the cost in dollars at the exchange rate used for

the transfer of funds.

Late April/ University/Globe Fee Invoices sent to the Branch President, with copies to the Branch Treasurer and BUSS Coordinator.

copies to the Branch Treasurer and BUSS Coordinator. Remission of funds in US dollars will be payable to ESU-US and due within 14 days of invoicing. Branches disperse any additional payments to the teachers for transportation and

stipends if applicable.

May 2015 Remission of funds in US dollars payable to ESU-US.

**July-August 2015** ESU BUSS Fellows attend their programs.



### **Funding and Partnerships**

The ESU BUSS courses are two to three weeks in duration and course fees are \$3,000 - \$5,000 each. The course fees include: tuition, most meals and dorm room with shared bath. Each ESU Branch decides whether to provide a full or partial scholarship and whether or not to contribute toward the teachers' airfare. Many teachers are delighted to receive partial fellowships and can raise additional, continuing education funds through other professional or personal means.

Your Branch BUSS Fellowship is the perfect opportunity to raise visibility of the ESU's education mission and partner with other local organizations. Identify and contact organizations or businesses in your community who would be interested in supporting the BUSS Fellowship.

#### **PARTNERING EVENTS:**

Some Branches hold an additional event in conjunction with their ESU BUSS Fellowship Award Ceremony. If a local organization is already partnering with you on the funding, we suggest your Branch try and collaborate with them on the award event. These events should connect in some way to English language, literature, history or international affairs. Following are some event suggestions to hold in conjunction with the awarding of your ESU BUSS Fellowship:

- Reception and Meal (Brunch, Luncheon, Dinner)
- BUSS Alum Teacher Workshop
- ESU Branch Meeting
- Lecture
- Book Reading/Signing



### **Mailings to Teachers**

This initial mailing should be sent to teachers/schools in the Fall.

#### **Necessary Materials:**

- Branch's BUSS Memo to Teachers: Introduces teachers to the Fellowship and gives essential information about participation. See following sample from ESU Denver Branch on following Handbook Page.
- Customize and attach ESU Sample BUSS Application Form found on BUSS Handbook pages 10-12.

#### **Instructions:**

- Update the Sample Memo to Teachers and Branch BUSS Application Form with your Branch-specific information (including your BUSS Coordinator's contact information and dates).
- Forward your Branch's customized BUSS Branch Application Form to Grant Hamel at ESU National Headquarters (<a href="mailto:ghamel@esuus.org">ghamel@esuus.org</a>) to add to your Branch's BUSS program page under Teacher Resources. Request teachers complete application form and submit online.
- Research local schools.
- Place the Sample Memo to Teachers in the body of an email to your local schools.
- Attach your Branch's BUSS Fellowship Application Form and email in a mailing to teachers and school administrators in your target area making sure to place email address in bcc line. Include past BUSS fellows and teachers involved in ESU programs (SSF, Shakespeare Competition and Middle School Debate).
- In your email encourage administrators and teachers to share and forward the opportunity.
- Send the email 2-3 times before your deadline and encourage teachers complete and submit online by including a link to your Branch BUSS Program page.

#### **Follow Up Mailing to Participating Teachers**

- Email teachers/schools who have returned the completed Branch BUSS Application Form stating the details of your Branch Finalists' Interviews. Be sure to include the date, time, location (full address) and any other necessary details. Request a confirmation of attendance.
- Attach the Branch Interview Invitation and Photo Release Form (on Handbook Page 20) to the email.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR ESU BUSS FELLOWSHIP INTERVIEWERS**

In an attempt to standardize the interview ratings awarded to the ESU BUSS candidates, the ESU has prepared the following descriptions to be used as guidelines.

- A Clearly outstanding candidate. Professionally and academically superior; innovative; open to new ideas; teachers who exhibit leadership qualities in their school and extra-curricular activities in many areas or very strong in one significant area. Would be an excellent participant and give back to their students and the ESU.
- A- Very strong candidate who would be successful if chosen.
  Academically curious—understands the personal and professional benefits of life-long learning; significant involvement in school's mission and extra-curricular activities. Minor deficiencies or interviewer's reservations prevent full A.
- B+ Perfectly acceptable candidate who would succeed. Some reservations about maturity, academic strengths, flexibility to adapt to new surroundings and pedagogy or extracurriculars.
- B A long shot. Might well succeed because of unusual strength in one area despite some reservations about others.
- C Not acceptable. Too weak academically. Primary interest seems to be in summer vacation in UK, rather than summer study.

### **Dispensing BUSS Fellowship funds**

The ESU remits a single payment to each British Institution on behalf of all the ESU Summer Fellows attending their respective programs. Accordingly, once fellows are accepted at the participating institutions, we will pay the institutions and invoice the Branches for the cost in dollars at the exchange rate used for our transfer of the funds. Invoices will be sent to the Branch Treasurer, with copies to the Branch BUSS Chair. Remission of the funds will be due upon receipt or in any case within 14 days of our invoicing the Branch.

Branches will continue to disperse payments directly to the teachers for transportation funds and stipends (if applicable). British University Summer School Fellowships likely do not meet the IRS' limited definition of a 'scholarship' as they do not involve candidates receiving payments to pursue a degree. Consequently they fall under the IRS designation as 'prizes or awards' which are taxable under IRS section 74. This means that Branches must provide teachers and the IRS with form 1099 Miscellaneous Income for the amount turned over to the teacher. Given that the awards to teachers involve continuing professional education it is likely that the grant monies they spend in connection with the fellowship are deductible as 'unreimbursed employee expense' but this is a matter for the individual recipients to consider.

#### **Summary of Payments**

- University/Globe Fees: Payable to ESU-US.
- Airfare: Payable directly to airline or check to teacher to reimburse for international airfare (if applicable).
- Stipend: Payable by check to teacher (if applicable).

#### **Cancellation Policy**

In the event that a BUSS fellow is unable to attend the program, he/she must notify the ESU Branch and the ESU Education Department in writing. Fees paid to the institution will be returned according to the individual school's cancellation policy, as specified in their materials. Branches should make it clear that the recipients will be personally liable for any BUSS fellowship fees disbursed or paid prior to departure in the event of a withdrawal.

At this time, the teachers do not need to obtain a visa for summer course. They will be entering the UK as a student visitor. A letter confirming their participation in the summer program will be supplied by their institution prior to departure and should be presented at immigration if requested.
