The Planetarium





France's third biggest telescope and its magnificent garden, located close to the Botanical Gardens, **the Planetarium** is a fabulous place for learning about astronomy and observing the skies (at night). The planetarium's wide range of dynamic exhibits gives everyone the chance to learn about the stars, while having fun at the same time.

While each of the city's quarters has its own quaint little parks and pleasant playgrounds, there are nevertheless some exceptional ones that deserve our special attention.

The Orangerie Park



ith its incredible vegetation (flower beds, rose garden and century-old trees), its lake, its boats and its waterfall, its storks, its little zoo, its games, its mini-farm, its carousel and its skateboard park, the Orangerie is a popular meeting place for joggers, walkers and families. It is also a welcome oasis during the hot summer months and a children's paradise. The Empress Josephine, wife of Napoleon I. loved strolling through this park. The lodge in the middle of the park is actually named after her. 26 hectares of nature for relaxing, strolling, picnicking, admiring cheeky monkeys, majestic lynxes and mischievous llamas! ocated in the Esplanade quarter, not far from the university campus, the Citadelle Park is favoured by students, who go there to study or relax. Built by Vauban in the years following 1681 and partially destroyed in 1870, the ramparts now mark the boundaries of a magnificent space punctuated by playgrounds and waterways, where children and adults come to relax or let off steam... much to the amusement of the ducks!

Two Shores Garden

A symbol of Franco-German friendship, this **cross-border park** boasts a footbridge for pedestrians and bikers that links Strasbourg to the town of Kehl in Germany. From the top of this central structure, there is a magnificent view over the Rhine. This border-free garden hosts plant exhibitions and cultural events, with facilities for children to enjoy throughout the year.

Botanical Gardens



n amazing oasis in the heart of the city (between the Palais Universitaire and the Astronomical Observatory), **the Botanical Gardens** are a favourite among students, families and walkers. Covering an area of almost 3.5 hectares, this living museum is home to more than 6,000 different tree and plant species, including a few experimental flower beds specially planted for research purposes. Don't miss:

■ The tropical hothouse, which covers an area of 336 m² and is teeming with rare and lush vegetation including treasures such as a traveler's tree, a giant bamboo and a fiddle leaf fig, etc.

Friedel wildlife park



At the heart of the Girlenhirsch recreational zone, by the banks of the III river, the collection at the Friedel wildlife park is unique in the Strasbourg area.
