Treasurer's Thoughts

"Guess what Mom, Christmas is only a few months away. Can I start my list of things I want you to surprise me with?" Do you remember when you kids said the same thing to you? The list always got longer each day and when Christmas time came you might have gotten everything on your list.

Now are you wondering why your conference treasurer is bringing up Christmas in the middle of August. Well I am suggesting it is time to make your list of year-end items that need to be completed before the end of December.

Start your list with the local organization making their contribution to the "Candle of Commitment". You would be submitting \$28.57 per min. in honor or in memory of Women of Courage. Your district treasurer will send the money to the conference. The announcement of the total money collected will happen at the Annual Celebration where an actual candle will burn. Any money received after October 1st will still be appreciated, so don't worry if you miss the deadline.

Continue adding to your list by complying your 2015 budget for the local executive committee to review. Once reviewed and voted on, be sure to send your information to your district treasurer. There is a special form that the district treasurer needs filled out by each local organization in the district.

The local treasurers in November will be selecting an auditor to review the financial records and submitting the auditor's name to the local organization for approval.

The list continues to get longer, but not harder to complete. The deadline for your final contribution to reach your district treasurer is Dec. 15. This will give the district treasurer time to get your money to the conference.

Now the last item on your list is closing the local organization's financial books. Be sure that all the bank accounts have been reconciled. Gather all your financial records, put them in order and after January 1, 2015 send them to the selected auditor. Once the audit has been completed, send a copy to your **district treasurer**.

Well we might not have gotten everything on our list, but you can be sure that many people have received gifts from the local organizations. That is what Christmas giving is about, the gift of mission money.



The Korean Mission u 2014 was a time of friendship, spiritual revival, and appreciation of church all rolled in one. The number of participants was a new record high; 98 adults and 5 youths totaling 103.

Mele Faiva and Roni Kuester came into the classroom to welcome the Korean sisters. Mele Faiva's speech in Korean was received with heartfelt gratitude from the audience as it was warm, genuine, and short. Roni and Jane (later) who were the architects of this year's Mission u came to say a simple "hi!" but left a strong impression. A few participants commented afterwards, "They are so humble and nice. It feels good to be here."

The Spirituality study was led by Rev. Elaine Cho on the topic of "How is it with your soul?" Rev. Cho's powerful and engaging lectures gave the participants the much needed encouragement to seek and rely on God in our everyday lives by consciously grounding ourselves in God through prayers, scripture reading and social involvement.

The Social Issue study was on the topic of "The Church and the People with Disabilities." The study leader, Dr. Kim Dohmin led the participants to be aware of the difficulties facing the people with disabilities in society as well as in church. His lecture was invaluable in that our perspective towards sisters and brothers with disabilities was reexamined, and corrected so as to help them lead productive and fulfilling lives. There are many more lessons, discussions and experiences to follow in this particular social issue, but the groundwork has been laid, thanks to Mission u, and we all took a small but significant step toward a deeper appreciation of the world we live in.

The highlight of the Mission u 2014 was the Cultural Night where the participants from diverse background of language, culture and tradition came together as one united in the purpose and mission of UMW. The Korean participants were so moved by the praise song of "*Imagine No Malaria*" words by Jane Stewart,

they collected a special offering for *Imagine No Malaria* project on the last day of Mission u. This is a testimony to this year's cultural night being a program where the participants enjoy, learn and appreciate the diversity of cultures in California-Pacific Conference AND move forward on the social issues of our times with a renewed sense of commitment in working together. It is time for our local Organizations to set goals for a new year of **mission** opportunities, locally and worldwide, as new leadership and program planning for the year ahead inspires us to fulfill the UMW purpose. The purpose we have before us is about our personal understanding of how God is at work in the world, and the corporate support of 97 **National Missions** and programs in **130 countries** to better the lives of women, children and youth.

Studies and programs, throughout the year, help prepare us for the inward work of spirituality that is essential to our outward expression of mission support. We recently have been blessed with the **2014 Mission u** where studies gave us tools to grow spiritually and to learn how mission is rooted in faith. Additionally, the study on disabilities teaches us about a current need for local mission and the Roma study teaches us about a geographic need. Make plans for your local organization and/or district to sponsor study groups using the Mission u studies.

Each local Organization should have a UMW 2013-2016 Handbook by now, so I am suggesting some homework from the Handbook. Read and reread pages 43-45. You will want to discuss each broad heading at a Leadership Team meeting to help implement goals for the new year. If the nominating process for 2015 does not include a Mission Education Coordinator for your Organization, the 2015 Leadership Team members that are elected will be responsible for planning and implementing the mission outreach of your Organization. The material on pages 43-45 of the Handbook will be very helpful, especially, if there is not a specific person elected as Mission Education Coordinator.

Please, study the **Mission Today**, **2014**, form as you plan your 2015 year and incorporate suggested items from it into your program agendas. It will save you trying to squeeze things in at the end of the year. A copy of the 2014 form is in this newsletter and in your district newsletters. It is to be filled out and returned to your **District Mission Education Coordinator** by **Dec. 15**. Each of the eight UMW districts has a coordinator, and if the local unit does not have one to be responsible for the forms return, it is the responsibility of the president to return the form to the district.

It is not surprising that donations to the four national missions in our conference have decreased with the increased prices, etc. of our economy. This is a reminder of the need for our support to help them maintain programs for serving the needy in their communities. (The Book of Discipline, 2012, cf. 256.5) Additional leaders are chosen, and committees or task groups are formed as needed.

Membership Counts & Conference 2013 Report

With the diligent effort such as phone calls to virtually ALL California Pacific United Methodist Churches, UMW District Membership Coordinators and its teams completed 2013 Cal-Pac Conference UMW Membership Counts and were reported to the National Office. The final count was 10,013, an increase of over 1000s, as the count was 8,860 in the beginning of the year.

What can we do to achieve 100% in reporting membership counts? I encouraged the District UMW Membership Coordinators to try and follow ever-successful yet fundamental example of visiting and making phone calls to the local churches. It is certain that there has been even more UMW activity in our churches and the counts should be over 15,000.
