


PARK GAZEBO RESERVATIONS AND SPECIAL EVENTS



Park Gazebos are available on a first come, first serve basis, unless a reservation is made. Reservations can be made for private functions by individuals or groups. By making a reservation, you and your party have exclusive use of the gazebo during that time. Applications for reservations are available on the City's website or at City Hall. Although all of the gazebos in the parks are available for the public to use at no charge, fees are incurred when reserving a gazebo. How much does it cost?

Residents: \$50/first 2-hours: \$25/additional 2-hours Non-Resident: \$60/first 2-hours: \$35/additional 2-hours

Special Event Permits are needed for events ranging from fundraisers, organized runs, music or movies in the parks, class reunions and more. In general, a permit is required for any organized activity involving the use of, or having impact upon, public property or public facilities, including, but not limited to parks, sidewalks, streets or the temporary use of private property in a manner that varies from its current land use. It is our goal to assist event organizers in planning safe and successful events that create a minimal impact on the communities surrounding the events. How much does it cost? THE COST OF PARK VANDALISM

This has been a busy summer for the park department. On top of their regular mowing and all activities associated with taking care of over 140 acres of parks, we have experienced some vandalism to our irrigation systems. Over 50 sprinkler heads have been broken in three of our parks since June. The cost associated with this type of vandalism includes purchase of replacement parts, staff time for repairs, and the need for increased police presence to prevent further damage.

Most often the causes of this type of vandalism stems from boredom, anger, revenge or defiance. The people that participate in this type of activity do not realize or care that the cost of this damage takes money away from other projects and fun equipment that might have been purchased. They also don't realize that as a tax payer each of us help pay to make the parks fun, clean and safe. Damage to equipment and play structures can take these pieces out of commission and make the park less enjoyable.

Things to remember about vandalism:

Destroying someone else's property isn't funny. It's

vandalism and it is a crime.

- When someone damages public property they are taking money away from property and programs each of us want to have and share.
- Fixing broken windows costs more than \$300. Fixing a basketball standard costs more than \$500. Cleaning up graffiti by having to repaint walls can cost hundreds of dollars. All of this is money that could have been used to buy new equipment, institute new programs or even hire more employees.
- In private property damage it costs property owners time and money to repair the damage caused by vandalism. The monetary costs are only a small part of the price-people feel less secure after their property is damaged and feelings of anger toward the community are also caused from property damage.
- If you notice anyone damaging or destroying property that belongs to us all make sure to call the police or city hall right away at 541-664-3321. Having the citizens keeping a look out for damage to park features will hopefully help catch those that are destroying public property.




