

The Day The Angela Bella Sprang A Leak.

It was three days before Christmas 1961 and the Angela Bella was due to dock in Tripoli, loaded with the surface Christmas mail coming via Malta. I was sitting happily in my office at 219 PURE when the phone went. It was Sgt Harry Kirk ringing from the docks saying, "I think you need to get down here Sir, we have a problem".

He was right. When I got to the Angela Bella it was to find the hold was awash and all the mail bags floating. I ended up in the hold with L/Cpl Brady humping wet bags into a net whilst Harry Kirk loaded the bags into a three tonner. I was standing knee deep in water and mail wearing shorts and no shirt when an immaculate young cavalry subaltern shouted over the hatch edge, "I say, you down there, where is your officer I need to know where our mail is". My response was "He"s here, it s here and if you want to get your shirt off you can come down and look, otherwise let me have some of your lads to help". He got me some GD men but kept his shirt on. I then emerged from the hold, as Cpl Bill Farmer had arrived to swap places and I started making phone calls.

I rang RAF Idris to see if I could borrow a hanger and the air blowers they used to cool down the interiors of aircraft and the RASC to borrow some tarps. Neither gueried my requests and, picking up the tarps en-route, we headed for Idris with our sodden loads in three tonners. We pulled into the designated hangar to find the blowers ready and some RAF lads to help. If I remember correctly there were about 250 bags and everyone buckled down to opening each bag and spreading its contents on the hangar

As the contents emerged they were covered by the tarps and the blowers angled down to start the drying process. Working day and night the parcels were dried, identified and sent to the units, each with a damage claim form. The hanger was filled with the smell of soggy paper and Christmas cake as we exhumed the last of the Christmas goodies. One of the items we managed to salvage was some very nice white lingerie which had acquired a less attractive design of holly leaves from its wrapping paper. The Post Orderly later told us it was part of her wedding trousseau.

By Christmas morning we were left with only two totally unidentifiable parcels, all the others had been logged, dried, identified and delivered! We were all too tired to enjoy Christmas Day but, with some great inter service cooperation the mail got through. One of the lads said that he had seen Father Christmas fly over Idris in the early hours of Christmas morning, but as he said the sleigh was drawn by camels we think it was the Christmas cake fumes and about 4 hours sleep out of 48 hours. My own children were too young to be told that Daddy had been giving Santa a hand for three days.

Oman - BFPOs - RAF Masirah and RAF Salalah

There is a "reunion visit" via Muscat to Salalah and probably a trip to Masirah in February of 2011. At this moment I am unable to join the party of seven probables; however I can supply full details to anyone wishing to join in.



I am writing an article on Posties who served at either of the above FPOs. The above Turtle shell clearly lists all those towards the end, who served on the Island of Masirah. Were you, or do you remember a mate being there in the 1960s / early 70s? I have some gaps pre the arrival of Tony James in July 1970, then Joe Kelly to Bruce Reiling – who came home in Aug 72. It would appear that Eddie Gratwick and the staff of 261 PURE helped out with cover, particularly a medevac, from their bases in Sharjah / Bahrain etc.

My early research, of the Sultan seeking increased UK Military support cover for his "Summer Palace" in Salalah, indicates an escalation in the late 1960s, Tom Martin was there in 1967 for just 3 months but cannot remember either Postie before or after. Gerry Leeks is my next NCO i/c until Feb 69; both were one man offices in these early years. I arrived in Nov 71, now under the control of 275 PCCU RE in Cyprus and Cpl Mick Herrieven became my buddy, as we covered the weekly away days to Masirah where Bob Moonie was the first known Cpl up there, alongside Bruce Reiling. I wondered it was maybe Joe Kelly or even Brian Lowe ?? - In any case his tour was up and he was "long-gone...." And Ron can"t remember for certain]



Rumours of BFPO Closures

(Quotes from the newspapers)

WITH its motto "Swift and Secure", the British Forces Post Office has been helping our forces across the world keep in touch with loved ones at home since the Peninsular Wars, more than 200 years ago. But now its future is in peril because of a "mean-spirited" Government plan to save just £1.7million a year. By September next year 2010, the axe will have fallen on BFPO post centres at 10 British bases in Europe, including Portugal, Belgium and Gibraltar.

As well as ensuring troops stay in touch with friends and families, the BFPO system is essential for servicemen and women to keep up with financial or administrative affairs. Many banks and lenders, including Marks & Spencer, refuse to send bank or credit card statements to addresses outside the UK unless they are BFPO. Open University literature and even postal election ballot papers will be hit. Parents serving abroad who want to send their children to university in Britain have complained they may be classed as foreigners and forced to pay far higher tuition fees. Even the cost of small luxuries such as weekly magazines will soar as subscribers find themselves paying foreign postage rates. Last night one serving infantryman, who did not wish to be named, complained: "We have to fight for decent equipment, fight for decent housing and now this; it's really the last straw. We"ve always relied on BFPO. It gives access to a safe and reliable system at UK prices no matter where you are in the world."

BFPOs in NATO locations to be retained

According to the Belfast Telegraph the Ministry of Defence has announced it is to maintain British Force Post Offices (BFPO) in 12 locations across mainland Europe after originally earmarking their closure for 2010. A spokesperson for the MoD said: "Families, federations and others have brought to our attention a number of potential impacts associated with the proposed closures of 12 British Forces Post Offices (BFPO). As a result, we have decided to maintain a BFPO service to these locations. They will retain their BFPO numbers so that personnel can continue to send and receive mail and access UK based services such as internet banking and online shopping. We are very concerned about the effect of these closures upon armed forces personnel and their families. Some of the effects might be mitigated by increases to Local Overseas Allowances (LOA) - which will reduce any savings to the public purse as a result of the closures. Other effects cannot be mitigated by LOA adjustments, such as:

- Extra delays in postal votes, and disincentive to vote as prepaid envelopes will not be valid
- Difficulties with banks, building societies and other financial institutions
- Difficulties obtaining goods by post
- Criminal record check problems when applying for employment
- Loss of counter staff familiar with Royal Mail and UK conditions

Thoughts on the Last Post

The Last Post is one of a number of bugle calls in military tradition which mark the phases of the day. Where "Reveille" signalled the start of a soldier's day, the "Last Post" signalled its end. It is believed originally to have been part of a more elaborate routine, known in the British Army as "tattoo" that had its origins in the 17th century. During the evening, a duty officer had to do the rounds of his unit's position, checking that the sentry posts were manned and rounding up the off-duty soldiers and packing them off to their beds or billets. He would be accompanied by one or more musicians. The "first post" was sounded when the duty officer started his rounds and, as the party proceeded from post to post, a drum was played. The drum beats told off-duty soldiers it was time to rest - if the soldiers were billeted in a town, the beats told them it was time to quit the pubs. "Tattoo" is a derivation of doe den tap toe, Dutch for "turn off the taps", a call which is said to have followed the drum beats in many a Dutch pub while English armies were campaigning through Holland and Flanders in the 1690s. (It is also from this routine that American practice of "taps" or "drum taps" originated.) Another bugle call was sounded when the party completed their rounds, when they reached the "last post": this signalled the night sentries were alert at their posts and gave one last warning to any soldiers still at large that it was time to retire for the evening. "Last Post" was incorporated into funeral and memorial services as a final farewell and symbolises that the duty of the dead is over and that they can rest in peace.

THE WORDS TO THE LAST POST

Come home! Come home! The last post is sounding for you to hear. All good soldiers know very well there is nothing to fear while they do what is right, and forget all the worries they have met in their duties through the year. A soldier cannot always be great, but he can be a gentleman and he can be a right good pal to his comrades in his squad. So all you soldiers listen to this - Deal fair by all and you'll never be amiss.
