- 1. Each KEY Club may enter a T-Shirt in District competition. The entry must be approved and signed by the faculty advisor or school principal. The Club T-Shirt Contest entry sheet must be affixed to the entry to be considered.
- 2. Each club may only submit one entry in this contest. Content, layout, color and general format of the T-Shirt is left to the discretion of the individual club.
- 3. Club T-Shirt entries must be postmarked and mailed to the convention mailing address:

  February 23, 2007. A T-Shirt in cotton and or polyester fabric must be submitted with the entry.
- 4. Judging of the Club T-Shirt will be on a point system as follows:

#### **FORMAT & CONTENT** - Total 75 points

Artistic Representation	15 pts.
General Content	15 pts.
Uniqueness of presentation	20 pts.
Layout & Design	25 pts.

- 5. Suitable awards will be presented for Club T-Shirts judged best on the basis of format and general content.
- 6. The decisions of the judges are final and no changes, alterations, or regradings will take place after the results have been certified by the judges and the Chairman of the Judges.
- 7. The Club T-Shirt entry must uphold the standards of KEY Club International.
