

The Great Outdoors Letter of Intent Guidelines and Application

The mission and purpose of *The Escondido Charitable Foundation* (the Foundation) is to improve the quality of life in Escondido by meeting emerging needs through:

- Encouraging and increasing responsible and effective philanthropy,
- Building a community endowment,
- Providing funds annually to organizations and causes, and
- Giving the community a vehicle for legacy planning and cash gifts that will benefit Escondido annually and in perpetuity.

The vision of the Foundation is to inspire a culture of giving that supports, strengthens and enriches the quality of life in the Escondido community now and for generations to come.

INTRODUCTION

The foundation, in its ninth grant cycle, invites nonprofits serving Escondido to submit a Letter of Intent (LOI) to express interest in applying for ECF's 2015-2016 grant cycle on the theme of The Great Outdoors. ECF will be accepting LOI's for creative projects that promote the rich natural resources and open spaces throughout Escondido. During this grant cycle, the ECF will make grants that support programs or projects, which foster healthy lifestyles, and connect, protect, or increase access to nature for people of all ages and abilities and improve the lives of those who live, work and play within the geographic boundaries of the Greater Escondido area generally defined by the Escondido Union High School District boundaries "to include the San Pasqual Valley, up to Deer Springs Road by Lawrence Welk and out toward Del Dios."

The Letter of Intent (LOI) is the first step in a two-step application process. The foundation will evaluate all LOI submissions and qualify those that meet the program and eligibility criteria. Organizations that are short-listed through the LOI process will be invited to submit a full application. The funding range is \$10K to \$30K.

The deadline for submitting completed LOIs is 5:00 p.m. (PST) on Monday, January 12, 2015

BACKGROUND

A future where nature is accessible, connected and protected for all to enjoy is a priority for Escondido residents. The Escondido Charitable Foundation is also grounded in the belief that access to nature is a core value in our community. Communities thrive when residents are active, happy, and healthy. The Escondido Charitable Foundation wishes to promote philanthropy, civic engagement, and collaboration between business, government and community to support the connection, protection and increased access to nature. We are making a call to action to neighborhoods, nonprofits and community leaders to come up with creative solutions that engage people in addressing this issue.

PROGRAM AND ELIGIBILTY CRITERIA

From improving quality of life to rejuvenating the bonds of our communities, the contributions of ECF members stimulate a sense of common purpose by bringing people together to address essential and emerging needs. Grant applications must be administered by a viable 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, public school or government agency interested in impacting Escondido's communities in the following ways:

- Proposed project must seek to increase access and promotion of the rich natural resources and open spaces.
- Applicants are encouraged to submit programs that also utilize strategies that will engage and involve the entire community (i.e. intergenerational, youth, elderly, culturally and linguistically appropriate projects, etc.)
- The Escondido Charitable Foundation encourages projects that demonstrate collaborative efforts.
- Program/project must serve Escondido community.
- Program/project must have measurable outcomes.
- Applicant must outline the strategies and approaches for success.
- Grant applications must be administered by a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization.
- Program/project must have long-term sustainability (future funding, viability, etc.).
- Project must be achievable within a 12-month time frame.
- The grant range is \$10K to \$30K

EXAMPLES of the programs could be, but are not limited to:

- Clean-ups or improvement of water quality of local creeks or natural lands
- Create art from found materials (e.g., ecobenches made from used water bottles, sculptures from plastic bags)

- Recycling, repurposing, and reusing activities that spotlight the negative impact of trash to natural resources and open spaces
- Cultivate and train future generations of environmental leaders and stewards. Engage the community, especially youth, in habitat conservation, restoration and ecology
- Design and conduct outdoor team building exercises
- Utilize multisensory experiences to expand knowledge and appreciation of wildlife in our region
- Provide innovative outdoor physical activities for seniors or mobility impaired
- Integrate outdoor experiences into mental and/or physical health treatment programs
- Activities in park settings that promote the history, culture and environment of surrounding neighborhoods.
- Foster economic, social and ecological health in our landscapes through education
- Activities promoting water conservation and education, such as zeroscape with native plants education, drought awareness, etc.
- Collaborative projects focusing on science and climate change awareness
- Community Garden Projects

These are merely **EXAMPLES**.



LETTER OF INTENT APPLICATION PROCESS

To submit your information, all applicants will need to access the secure online LOI application form found at https://mycommunity.sdfoundation.org/. The application includes information about your organization, as well as long-form questions about your proposed program. Due to a new online application process, all applicants need to request a *MyCommunity* account before receiving access to the online application (Detailed instructions are below).

Because granting access to the online system will take up to two business days to complete, please be sure you leave enough time to negotiate this process. All applications must be submitted online; hard copies or emailed applications WILL NOT be accepted.

DEADLINE

The deadline for submitting the LOI is <u>Monday, January 12, 2015 at 5:00 p.m.</u> Requests for *MyCommunity* accounts must be received by <u>Monday, January 5, 2015 at 5:00 p.m.</u>

Step 1: New User Registration


IMPORTANT: Whether you are requesting a new account or have a current one (detailed below), granting access in the online system will take up to **two business days to complete**. Please be sure you leave enough time to negotiate this process as late proposals will not be accepted.

If you do not have a MyCommunity Username and Password (majority of applicants):

- 1. Visit https://mycommunity.sdfoundation.org
 - You will be on a website with The San Diego Foundation header.
 - In the center, click "New User Registration," circled in red:



- 2. Complete your contact information (see below).
- 3. Check "Escondido CF Applicant" in the "Involvement with The San Diego Foundation" section, circled in red:



4. Select a User ID and Password.

- 5. Click "Submit." You will receive an initial welcome email to let you know that your request was received.
- 6. Wait up to two business days before proceeding to "Step 2: Submitting the Proposal" below. If you already have a *MyCommunity* Username and Password:

- 4. To begin a new application, click the "Begin a New Application" button.
 - Within the application, you will be able to save your information to return later if necessary by clicking the "Save and Continue" button at the bottom of the application pages.
 - Please note:

- It is highly recommended that you type your responses in a Word document then copy and paste. We will not be able to send you a copy of the information you submit.
- Please make sure that you have not entered more than the maximum characters allowed for each field. The system will cut off any characters over the stated limit.
 Please verify that your answers are complete before moving on to the next question.
- · Invisible characters are included in total character count.
- All questions must be answered in the online application; attachments will not be accepted.
- 5. To exit and save an application, you do not need to Log Out. Simply close your browser and your information will be saved.
- 6. When you need to return to an application you've saved, please click the "Return to Application" button on the main landing page. You will then see:



- 7. Click on the "Requestor Name" of the saved version you wish to edit and you will be taken to that application to continue your work. Please note, you will need to click the "Save and Continue" button at the bottom of the application to save new entries.
- 8. Once application is completed, click "Submit Selections" to submit your application. You will receive a confirmation message that your application has been received.
