The UCLA McNair Program will select 10 - 15 students each year.

To be eligible for the UCLA McNair Scholars Program, students must meet at least ONE of the following criteria:

- Low-income and first generation college student (neither parent has a bachelor's degree)
- Underrepresented student
 - ·Groups that are underrepresented in graduate education

Students must also:

- Be a UCLA student majoring in the Humanities or Social Sciences
- Have Junior level standing or higher (at least 90 units but no more than 175 units by Fall 2008)
- Have a 3.25 GPA or higher
- Demonstrate academic potential for graduate study
- Be a United States Citizen or Permanent Resident
