MISSION

Smart Cookie prepares Latina/o immigrants who are first generation college students* for educational success and lives of leadership and responsibility to self, family and community. We do this by providing scholarships and facilitating an integrative support structure in order to assist students to complete AAs, BAs, graduate degrees and other forms of education beyond high school.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Smart Cookie Scholarship Fund supports first and second generation immigrant students from Latin America who are highly motivated and who would not otherwise receive the necessary assistance to pursue an education beyond high school. Scholarship awards are determined by type of school the student attends (UC, CC, CSU), and access to other financial assistance. In addition to scholarships to finance education, the program provides advising, personal development and enrichment activities, networking opportunities, and other scholarship events to ensure students succeed at the university level and beyond. Smart Cookie aims to foster a culture of respect, commitment, pride, and community investment among our Latina/o students.

* First generation college: students who are the first in their family to attend college; parents did not attend college.

In some cases, Smart Cookie will support the completion of a certificate program at a private institution if the certificate cannot be obtained at a community college. However, it does not support private technical schools such as fashion design schools, nursing schools, etc. that charge private school rates and do not have college transferable classes.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicant must:

- Be a first or second generation immigrant from Latin America;
- Be a first generation college student;
- Reside or attend high school in one of the following cities: Fremont, Newark, Menlo Park, East Palo Alto, Redwood City, Hayward, Union City, Santa Clara or the unincorporated area of North Fair Oaks;
- Be one of the following: a) eligible to enroll in community college or an undergraduate program;
 b) current undergraduate college student; OR c) current community college student (including students enrolling in a public technical training program resulting in a certificate);
- Attend a California public university or community college. (A student enrolling in California private college or university, studying out of state or abroad will not be considered);
- Demonstrate significant financial need;
- Demonstrate leadership potential and willingness to contribute to their community;
- Have a willingness to give back to the scholarship as a future mentor or board member; AND
- Be available to attend an interview in May or June if selected as a finalist.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

If admitted to the Smart Cookie Scholarship, you must:

- Attend a mandatory orientation in August;
- Maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 (i.e, C average);
- Submit a short weekly report to your assigned Smart Cookie advisor and Missa Perron, the Smart Cookie program associate;
- Complete 20 hours of community service per semester;
- Attend Smart Cookie events including but not limited to: orientation, scholar lunches, interviews each semester and an end-of-year celebration in June;

- Apply to at least three other scholarships if receiving more than \$1,000 of support from Smart Cookie; AND
- Not work more than 20 hours per week if enrolled in school full-time.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Your completed application must be emailed by MAY 20, 2013 at 11:59 PM
- Essays must be typed; AND
- Applications missing any of the required documents will be considered incomplete and will not be reviewed unless arrangements have been made with Missa Perron in advance.

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The timeline below provides a general outline for the scholarship process. Please note that we reserve the right to modify these dates if necessary.

Please verify that you have read the timeline below and will be able to commit to the following events if selected as a scholarship finalist/scholarship recipient.

End of May/ **mid-June 2013** Students must attend an in-person, panel interview. Location TBD but will most likely be on the Peninsula. Please note that you will not receive notification if you are not selected for an interview.

July-August 2013 Smart Cookie Board will make final scholarship decisions and notifications of awards will be mailed and emailed.

August 2013 A mandatory Smart Cookie Scholarship Orientation for new and returning students will be held in the Bay Area—details to follow.
