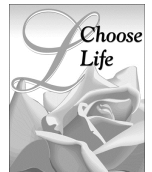

Looking forward to a fun time with all of you participating in any way that you see fit.

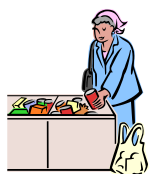

All are invited to join the Eucharistic Apostles of Divine Mercy Reciting the Chaplet for the Sick and Dying during Eucharistic Adoration. Our Lord told St. Faustina: "My daughter, encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given to you. It pleases me to grant everything They ask of me by saying The Chaplet.....Write that when they say this Chaplet in the Presence of the dying I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the Just Judge but as the Merciful Savior (Diary 1541). At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say the chaplet; or when others say it for a dying person, the indulgence is the same (Diary, 811).
