Pilot Starts May 4, 2011

USPTO Prioritized Examination Pilot

Prosecution will be processed under 3 Tracks

- Prioritized Examination of an <u>original</u> utility or plant nonprovisional application (also available for new continuing applications – Continuations, Divisions)
- Not available for Reissue or Reexam Applications
- Not available for 371 National Phase Applications (file bypass Continuation)
- Final Disposition in 12 months
- Extensions not permitted filing extension terminates prioritized status
- Limited to first 10,000 Requests filed during 2011 fiscal year
- Available for new applications filed on or after May 4, 2011

- Request fee of \$4000 (plus publication fee \$300 and processing fee \$130 currently no small entity reduction)
- Regular application filing fees must be paid in addition to Request fee
- Request fee may increase if Congress passes patent reform
- Filing a search report and written analysis is <u>not</u> required
- ₱ Different requirements than Accelerated Examination less rigorous
- Track I rules will be implemented first so that Prioritized Examination option is available before Delayed Examination
- ₱ 10,000 application limit will be re-evaluated at the end of 2011 fiscal year

Filing Requirements

- Request for PE must be filed with new application
- Up to 4 independent claims; 30 total claims
- No multiple dependent claims allowed
- Must pay excess claim fees at time of filing
- Complete application as required by 37 C.F.R. 1.51(b)
- Signed Declaration at time of filing
- Must file using Electronic Filing System (EFS)

- Pilot promises Final Disposition in 12 months
- Events that define Final Disposition
 - Mailing Notice of Allowance
 - Mailing Final Office Action
 - Filing Notice of Appeal
 - Filing RCE
 - Declaration of Interference
 - Abandonment
 - Special status ends during Appeal or Interference

Track II - Examination under current procedure

- Default track if Track I or Track III are not requested
- No changes under Track II prosecution procedure

Track III - Delayed Examination

- Delay period cannot exceed 30 months in an original utility or plant application filed under 35 U.S.C. 111(a)
- Request delay in docketing application for Examination by filing Request for delay in payment of Search, Examination, Claims, and other surcharge fees
- Must pay filing fee
- Track III rules may not be ready by May 4, 2011
