Clothing, Patterns, Material, Headwear Resources

Ebay.com and Etsy.com – search Civil War (civilian man, boy, girl, lady, etc) and the item you are looking for (pants, dress, bonnet, pattern). You can find great deals on used clothing from reenactors, as well as new, bonnet and hats (trimmed and untrimmed).

- Ladies' and girls' clothing is abundant. The cheapest hoops are on ebay.
- Civilian men's and boys are available in less quantity... for men, make sure you specify 'civilian men's' in your search or you will get the plethora of military clothing items. Even with boys, many of the jackets are military jackets not civilian.
- New men's can be found relatively cheaply.
- Ladies, be sure to read the actual measurements of the clothing item. Do not trust women's sizing (size 8, 10, etc). If measurements are not listed, ask.
- Beware! There are many items listed as Civil War that are not accurate. Steer clear of items listed as multiple periods "Civil War, Revolutionary, Renaissance, Gothic".

- A variety of items for both the gentlemen and the ladies... For the men, look for the link for civilian clothing under the men's catalog. It's interspersed with many links to military items. The Ladies Catalog is more straightforward. The site is odd in that you have scroll all the way to the bottom of the page to see links to more clothing items. Make sure you do, or you'll miss some good stuff!
- Good variety of pre-made ladies bodices (blouse)...to mix and match with skirt. If you are looking for a dress use colonels1lady on ebay... she's cheaper and dresses are equally as nice as this site.
- Ladies, if you are looking for a hat rather than a bonnet, check out this site for nice un-trimmed hats at a reasonable price.
