Entitlement to a Canadian Passport

Important Notice—We recommend that you not finalize your travel plans until you receive the requested passport.

- A Canadian passport is the only reliable and universally accepted travel and identification document for Canadians who travel abroad.
- Issued to Canadian citizens only, a Canadian passport reflects the identity of the applicant as determined by documentary evidence of citizenship and documents to support identity.
- For Canadians under 16 years of age use form PPTC 042, Child Abroad General Passport Application.
- The bearer of a previous Canadian passport may be eligible to apply for a passport through the simplified renewal application process using form PPTC 482, Adult Abroad Simplified Renewal. Consult our website at passportcanada.gc.ca.

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Translation

All documents submitted throughout the passport application process that are in a language other than English or French must be translated by a certified translator.

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Requirements Checklist

- ☐ All three (3) pages of the application form completed and signed within the last twelve (12) months.
- ☐ Two (2) identical unaltered passport photos taken within the last twelve (12) months.
- ☐ Application form and one of the photos certified by your guarantor.
- ☐ Proof of Canadian citizenship (original only). The document will be returned to you.
- □ Document(s) to support identity.
- ☐ Any valid Canadian travel document (passport, certificate of identity or refugee travel document) issued in your name.
- □ The fee.

Additional documents or information may be requested in support of this application.

Period of Validity and Fee

Where the application is made **outside Canada** or the passport is to be delivered outside Canada: 5-year validity – Can\$190* 10-year validity – Can\$260*

*A Can\$25 consular services fee is included in the above-mentioned fee.

The fee is in Canadian funds and should be converted to local funds. Please confirm fee and accepted methods of payment with the nearest Government of Canada office abroad.

There is a separate non-refundable Can\$45 administrative fee for the replacement of a valid lost or stolen Canadian travel document.

Method of payment

- · Cash (where accepted).
- Debit card (Interac), Visa debit, virtual debit or other prepaid cards (Visa, MasterCard, American Express) only for in-person applications submitted by the cardholder. Prepaid debit cards are not accepted.
- Credit card (where accepted).
- Certified cheque, traveller's cheque or international money order (postal or bank) in the exact amount, payable to the Canadian Embassy, High Commission or Consulate as the case may be (where accepted).

Important

- Every person who requests a passport service must pay the applicable fee in the exact amount.
- Applicants who cancel their application or are refused a passport are not eligible for a refund of the passport service fee. Only the consular services fee of Can\$25, applied only to adult applications, is refundable.
- · Administrative fees and applicable interest will be applied to all dishonoured payments.
- · Fees are subject to change.

All Canadian passports contain 36 pages.



Credit Card Information (where accepted)

Payment by credit card for passport services at a Government of Canada office abroad requires the completion of a separate credit card authorization form. By completing and signing the authorization form, you are providing formal authorization to charge your credit card for payment of services requested. The form must be included with your passport application.

Important Notice: There is a fee to use the credit card payment service, a payment solution developed by the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development Canada. This fee is separate and independent from the amount payable to the Government of Canada for any passport service.

Where to Apply

Submit your application at the nearest Government of Canada office that provides passport services in the country where you reside or are visiting. A list of Government of Canada offices abroad is available online at travel.gc.ca or consult your local telephone directory.

Offices authorized to process passport applications include:

- · Canadian embassies
- · Canadian high commissions
- Canadian consulates (except those headed by honorary consuls).

Personal Information

Surname and given name(s) to appear in passport

Write the name to appear in the passport. If you are requesting a passport in a name that is different from the name that appears on the documentary evidence of citizenship, please note the following:

- For a change of surname resulting from a relationship, you must provide a marriage or common-law relationship certificate, or a document demonstrating termination of the relationship.
- For a legal change of name change, you must provide a birth certificate or citizenship certificate issued in the new name.

Additional documentation will be required to verify your identity as well as the name to appear in the passport (see section L).

Surname (last name) at birth and former surname (last name)

Complete if different from the surname (last name) to appear in the passport (for Passport Program, Citizenship and Immigration Canada information only—will not appear in the passport).

Date of birth


If your proof of citizenship does not show a complete date of birth, the specific **year**, **month** and **day** of your birth will be entered as shown on your supporting identification. Provide original or copies signed and dated by your guarantor of any supporting identification showing that date of birth.

Place of birth

Your place of birth must be provided on the application form. If you do not wish the place of birth to appear in the passport, submit form PPTC 077, Request for a Canadian passport without a place of birth, available online at passportcanada.gc.ca.

Signature

You **must** sign your usual signature on all **three (3)** pages. Your signature in section 1 will appear in the passport. Therefore, your signature **must not** exceed the inner limits of the signature box.



Declaration of Guarantor

A guarantor is a person other than yourself who confirms your identity.

The guarantor must:

- have known you personally for at least two (2) years*;
- *To know an applicant personally means that the guarantor is able to confirm aspects of the applicant's personal attributes. A family member or a person who resides at the same address as you (the applicant) may be the guarantor provided that the individual meets the specified requirements.
- perform the following three (3) tasks free of charge:
 - 1. Complete and sign the Declaration of Guarantor (section 2) (ensure you have completed and signed all three (3) pages of the application before submitting it to your guarantor).
 - 2. Write "I certify this to be a true likeness of (your name)" on the back of one (1) of your photos, and sign it.
- 3. If applicable, sign and date a copy of each document to support your identity (see section L).
- know you well enough to be confident that the statements you have made in the application form are true.
- be accessible to Passport Program, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) for verification; Passport Program reserves the right to request a new guarantor.

The applicant must not assist the guarantor in performing his or her duties. If your guarantor requires assistance, contact Passport Program.

The guarantor can be either a Canadian passport holder (see section I-A below) or a member of an eligible occupation (see section I-B below).

Section I-A: Canadian passport holder, the guarantor must:

- be a Canadian citizen, 18 years of age or over;
- hold a **5-year** or a **10-year** Canadian passport that is valid or has expired within the last year from the date we receive this application:
- have been 16 years of age or over when the application was submitted for the passport identified in section 2 of this application form:
- provide the requested information contained in the passport issued in his or her name by completing, by hand, the declaration of guarantor section of the application form.

It is not necessary that a Canadian passport holder guarantor to reside in the same country as the applicant.

OR

Section I-B Occupation, the guarantor must:

- currently work and/or reside within the area of accreditation served by the Government of Canada office abroad where the application is submitted; and
- be currently registered/licensed with the appropriate local authority to practice one (1) of the following professions:
 - Dentist

Notary public

· Medical doctor

- Pharmacist
- · Dean/head of university or college
- Veterinarian

 Judge · Lawyer/notary

- · Police officer
- range of banking services (cash withdrawals, deposits, savings). The above list is not a recognition or endorsement by Passport Program of professional status or superior qualifications.

It is not necessary that a guarantor from the eligible list of occupations be a Canadian citizen.

If you have **not known** an eligible guarantor from either section I-A. Canadian passport holder, or section I-B. Occupation, for at least two (2) years, complete form PPTC 132, Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor, available at any Government of Canada office that provides passport services. The form must be completed at your expense before a person authorized by law to administer an oath or solemn affirmation. This may delay the processing time of the passport.

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Previous Canadian Travel Document

- Enclose any valid Canadian travel document (passport, certificate of identity or refugee travel document) issued in your name. If this passport is valid for more than twelve (12) months from the date the application is submitted, provide a written explanation as to why you are applying at this time. Should Passport Program, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) not be satisfied that you have a valid reason for applying early, your application for a new passport may be refused.
- A person's name may appear in only one (1) valid Canadian travel document.

Note: If a valid Canadian travel document has been lost, stolen, damaged or is inaccessible, complete form PPTC 203, Declaration, available online at passportcanada.gc.ca. A Canadian travel document, once reported lost or stolen, is no longer valid. If found, it must not be used for travel and must be returned immediately to Passport Program or if abroad to the nearest Government of Canada office. There is an administrative fee for the replacement of a valid lost or stolen Canadian travel document (see section D).



Proof of Canadian Citizenship

Provide one (1) of the documents indicated in section 4 of the application form (original only). It will be returned to you. Additional information may be requested to confirm your citizenship.

If you are a woman who, before 1947, married a man who was not a British subject, contact Passport Program.

Certificate of birth in Canada

Only official birth documents issued by the vital statistics office of the applicant's province or territory of birth in Canada are accepted. Certain exceptions may apply. More information is available online at passportcanada.gc.ca.

Certificate of Canadian citizenship

Commemorative documents of citizenship, are **not** accepted. If you require a certificate of Canadian citizenship, contact the nearest Government of Canada office. You may also visit the Citizenship and Immigration Canada website at cic.gc.ca.



Documents to Support Identity

- Provide at least **one (1)** document to support your identity with the name, sex, date of birth, signature and photo to appear in the passport. More than one document may be used to fulfill the requirements.
- All documents submitted to support your identity must be valid and, must be issued by a federal or, provincial/territorial authority (or local equivalent abroad),
- The document (or documents when combined), must include your name, sex, date of birth, signature and photo.
- Copies are acceptable provided your guarantor has signed and dated a copy of each document (both sides) confirming that the original document has been seen. If you are submitting original documents, they will be returned to you.
- If you are submitting copies and are using form PPTC 132, Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor, the same official who signs the Declaration must also sign and date the copies of the original document (both sides) to indicate that the original document has been seen.



Canadian Passport Photo Instructions

You must submit two (2) identical photos with each passport application.

The photos must:

- be taken by a commercial photographer;
- be clear, sharp and in focus. Photos may be in colour or in black and white:
- have a neutral facial expression (eyes open and clearly visible, mouth closed, no smiling);
- have uniform lighting—no shadows, glare or flash reflections;
- be taken straight on with the face and shoulders centred and squared to the camera;
- be taken in front of a plain white or light-coloured background to clearly distinguish the person from the background. Photos must reflect/represent natural skin tones;
- be originals that have not been altered in any way or taken from an existing photo;
- reflect your current appearance (taken within the last twelve (12) months); and
- be professionally printed on plain, high quality photographic paper (photos printed at home and photos printed on heavy weight paper are not acceptable).

The following must appear on the back of one photo

- The name and complete address of the photo studio and the date the photo was taken. The photographer may use a stamp or handwrite this information (stick-on labels are not acceptable).
- The guarantor's signature.

Additional information

- Glasses, including tinted prescription glasses, may be worn in photos as long as there is no glare and the eyes are clearly visible. The red-eye effect and sunglasses are not acceptable.
- Hats and head coverings must not be worn, except for religious beliefs or medical reasons. However, the head covering must not cast shadows on the face and the full face must be clearly visible.

Privacy Notice Statement

All personal information provided on this application form is collected by Passport Program, Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) for the purpose of determining entitlement of the applicant to a Canadian passport and to provide information to the Consular Operations Bureau of the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development Canada in the event that the passport holder requires assistance while travelling abroad. In the performance of those services, personal information is collected, used and disclosed under the authority of the Canadian Passport Order and in accordance with the Privacy Act and any other federal laws, regulations and policies applicable to the protection of personal information, as described in Personal Information Bank PPTC PPD 102 (Regular and Official Travel Passports). In the context of the delivery of passport services, CIC and other federal government institutions or Government of Canada offices abroad assisting in the delivery of passport services may exchange personal information. In addition, in determining current and ongoing entitlement and to maintain the integrity of the passport program, all personal information collected is subject to verification and security queries to authenticate identity and citizenship, as well as to identify the existence of grounds for refusal to issue a passport, the revocation of a currently valid passport or the refusal of passport services. In the same context, the guarantor's personal information is also subject to verification and security queries to determine whether the individual meets the guarantor requirements. Personal information may be disclosed to third party entities, such as law enforcement authorities and identity document issuing institutions, for verification and security queries required in the delivery of passport services. Personal information may also be disclosed by third party entities to CIC or other federal government institutions or Government of Canada offices abroad for those same purposes. CIC may contact the applicant/passport holder to solicit feedback about passport services.
