OUR ATLANTIC CAMPS

Camp Morton, Kejimikujik National Park, NS (Session: July 2-8, 2016)

The Canadian Diabetes Association has operated Camp Morton continuously since 1990, founded by Lorne Abramson and Dr. Bruce Morton as part of the "Diabetes without Borders" program. Both campers & staff at Camp Morton sleep in tents at Jim Charles Group Campground, in the beautiful Kejimikujik National Park, Nova Scotia. Camp Morton offers a one week session for youth age 13-14 living with type 1 diabetes, as well as a Leadership Development program for youth ages 15-16, which is paired with Camp Lion Maxwell located in Barss Corner.

Camp Dia-Best, Greenhill Lake, NB (Session: July 9-15, 2016)

The Canadian Diabetes Association has operated Camp Dia-Best continuously since 1967. Camp Dia-Best is held at Green Hill Lake Camp, on the shores of Greenhill Lake, in beautiful York county New Brunswick. Camp Dia-Best offers a one week session for children and youth ages 7-14 living with type 1 diabetes, as well as a Leadership Development program for youth ages 15-16, which is paired with Camp Red Fox located in Canoe Cove, PEI.

Camp Douwanna, Salmonier Line, NL (Session: July 23-29, 2016)

The Canadian Diabetes Association has operated Camp Douwanna continuously since 1964. Camp Douwanna is held at Lavrock Camp and Conference Centre off the Salmonier Line, a part of the scenic and historic Irish Loop of Newfoundland. Camp Douwanna offers a one week session for children and youth ages 7-14; as well as a Leadership Development program for youth ages 15-16.

Camp Red Fox, Canoe Cove, PE (Session: July 30 - August 5, 2016)

The Canadian Diabetes Association has been involved in children's camping in Prince Edward Island since the early 1990s. Today, Camp Red Fox is held at Canoe Cove Christian Camp in scenic Canoe Cove, a facility with a camping history dating back to the 1950s. Camp Red Fox offers a one week session for children and youth ages 7-14 living with type 1 diabetes, as well as a Leadership Development program for youth ages 15-16, which is paired with Camp Dia-Best located in Greenhill Lake, NB

Camp Lion Maxwell, Barss Corner, NS (Session: August 13-19, 2016)

The Canadian Diabetes Association has operated Camp Lion Maxwell continuously since 1964, sponsored by the Lions Clubs of Nova Scotia and named in honour of Lion Peter Maxwell from the Truro Lions Club. Camp Lion Maxwell is located on the beautiful shore of Lake William in Lunenburg County, Nova Scotia. Camp Lion Maxwell offers a one week session for children ages 7-12 living with type 1 diabetes, as well as a Leadership Development program for youth ages 15-16, which is paired with Camp Morton located at Kejimikujik National Park.

Minimum Requirements

- **Standard First Aid and CPR 'C'.**
- **Criminal Reference Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening in accordance with D-Camps CRC-VSS Policy.**

All new and returning staff must provide either a CRC or CRC and VSS according to the policy below. We will accept a criminal record check that has been completed within 12 months of hire and a vulnerable sector check within 3 years. We will also accept valid education service cards from Saskatchewan, Nova Scotia and Ontario. The original check(s) must be verified by Association staff for authenticity and a copy will be taken for our files.

Under 18	You will need a Criminal Record Check only You must have a CRC run through a local police service or the RCMP
18 to 25	You will need a Criminal Record Check only Check can be completed through BackCheck, a local police service or the RCMP
26 and over with a Vulnerable Sector Search (VSS) within last 3 years	You will need a Criminal Record Check only Check can be completed through BackCheck, a local police service or the RCMP Copy of valid VSS must be provided upon hire
26 and over without a Vulnerable Sector Search (VSS) within last 3 years	You will need a Criminal Record Check <u>AND</u> Vulnerable Sector Search Staff/volunteer must visit local police service or the RCMP
