

Prayer Candle Ministry

Candles have always been an important symbol in the Christian Church. In ancient times, a candle was left burning over the church altar to symbolize the presence of Christ among us. The Prayer Candle, as in the past, symbolizes Christ's presence among us and in our lives. It is Christ's presence who gives us the holy assurance of God each day of our life.



How to Use Your Prayer Candle As a Prayer Light

Decide on a time that is best for you. Some light the candle at meal time as a reminder that Christ is known to us in the breaking of the bread. Some light the candle in the morning, some in the evening. Some have a special place, some among everyday things. Some bring an unlit candle to work as a reminder. Some purchase battery-operated candles for hospital and sick rooms. Each finds the best time and place. The most difficult is to begin and to find what is best for you. Some suggestions for beginning are: to find a quiet place where you can sit or kneel comfortably, think about all the things that have been on your mind during the day, try to put them gently to one side. Do not pretend they do not exist, but try to make a space so that you can give your whole attention to God. Light the candle, then just sit for a few minutes, enjoying the warmth and light of the candle. Read a prayer, think about God, think about God being with you in silence. Your stillness and your attentiveness are prayers. Share your life with Christ. End with the Lord's Prayer. Let the candle be a reminder of the presence of Christ, who brings light into our lives and that God holds us gently and quietly in his love.

Family Promise of Southern Ocean County has been assisting children and their families since 2009. Over the years we have mobilized many people from area congregations and community groups that have volunteered their time and compassion to help our guests move from hopeless to hopeful, all from the random acts of kindness that our volunteers provide to our families.

With the aftermath of the storm many of our volunteers were affected either directly or indirectly with their homes, families or jobs. Many congregations stepped into action assisting the community with many needs. By mid January Family Promise was full, hosting 14 children and their parents that were affected by the storm. Over the past 7 months, we have interviewed over 35 families in need and assisted an additional 44 families of which 29 where directly storm related. During the past 18 months, all the families that have been in our network have secured housing for their families. This is primarily due to all of the support that is received by our wonderful volunteers and all of the support that is given to our families.

Some of our congregations are still helping with the recovery efforts. Many have taken on hosting volunteers from all over the country. This has put many limitations to our efforts in helping the families that we serve. We are in great need of assistance from other congregations for shelter, and volunteers to provide meals and serve as an overnight hosts. 


